Considerable planning went into this meeting to ensure all members of the Province and guests would be able to access the proceedings, and the Provincial Grand Supreme Ruler, R.Wy.Bro. Dries Van der Burgh was delighted when almost the entire membership of the Province were in attendance. With many other notable guests also joining, the total number of brethren present was in excess of 127.



Although administrative in nature, the meeting was a joy to attend, with many brothers resuming masonic friendships face to face for the first time since the requirement to suspend regular meetings throughout the Province.

The Provincial Grand Chaplain led the memorial to those brothers of had passed to a higher service during the previous year, with a special note to his Royal Highness, the Duke of Edinburgh. A full minute of silent contemplation was held.



The Prov.G.S.R. appointed his officers for the year, and upon the reappointment of his Deputy, Wy.Bro. Tan Rusby, took great pleasure in highlighting the work Tan has been doing over the year to support him with the smooth running of the Province at Conclave level.



The Prov.G.S.R. went on to deliver his address to the brethren, the highlight of which was arguably his announcement that through prudent management of Provincial resources meant that no Provincial dues no joining fee and the first year subscription free to new members. This wonderful act will allow for many planning to join The Order of the Secret Monitor in Sussex to do so with little or no financial outlay for one or even two years. Well done Sir!



The Prov.G.S.R. invited the Deputy Grand Supreme ruler, R.Wy.Bro. James R. Hodge and the Grand Secretary, R.Wy.Bro. Ryan Williams to speak, who both gave positive and upbeat reports on the wider Order's work during the period of Covid restrictions, and the work being done at MMH to ease the burdens on members directly. Freemasonry at the national and provincial level has certainly not forgotten the hardship the current Covid crisis has caused to many of its members and has responded magnificently.





• And for individuals making their first donation under the scheme, qualification as a Life Governor of the Mark Benevolent Fund – the first step on the ladder of honorifics.

Monies raised by the take-up of Festival Stewardships will, of course, be included in each respective Festival total.
