## But what's the point?

Whether you're a 'digital native' or 'digital native' effective use of hashtags will enable you to draw attention, to organize, and to promote your social media postings and tweets. They make it easier for people to find, follow and contribute to 'conversations.'

There's only three simple things you need to remember about using hastags:

- 1. No spaces
- 2. No punctuation
- No special characters

How about a story that sounds like 'Game of Thrones meets Freemasonry'. We're talking about the Third Century AD, when the Roman Empire was collapsing, weakened by political corruption and division. Within a period of ten years eight emperors or would-be emperors were killed, many having been assassinated by their own troops. Sounds straight out of the pages of Game of Thrones doesn't it? Thankfully, a slide presentation and accompanying script, which has been used as an introduction to the Red Cross of Constantine by R. III Kt David John Roach, Intendant-General for North & East Yorkshire, has been produced.

It was researched and written by W.Kt. James Steele, a young man who is a Past Provincial Lecturer in the Craft and amended by III.Kt. Neil Webster, P.G.St.B.(C), Deputy Intendant-General.
