

Ron Bridger on the march to raise awareness of Prostate Cancer



Prostate Cancer kills 11,000 men every year – that's one every 45 minutes. Most of us know someone who has died from, or is suffering from, this dreadful disease. If it is caught in time, it is almost always treatable, but the disease does not occupy a high profile in the scale of prioritisation for research and treatment.

Prostate Cancer UK is making enormous efforts to change the perception of this disease, and to reduce the annual toll of suffering and death among men, of all ages. That is why I have signed up to March the Month, and have committed to walking an average of at least 11,000 steps **every day** in March, in a bid to raise as much money as I can for the Charity. My initial target was £1000, but the response to date has been such that the total raised is now approaching £7000. Will you help me get to £10,000 by donating on my Just Giving page:

Introducing R.Dist.Comp. Kenneth Barrington (Barry) Chalkley, M.B.E., the new Provincial Grand Summus for Devon & Cornwall in the Scarlet Cord



Greetings Brethren and Companions all. I am Barry Chalkley and on 9 March 2021 the Grand Summus of the Order of the Scarlet Cord, Most Distinguished Companion Ian Stanley Currans, honoured me at a virtual meeting of the Province of Devon & Cornwall, by installing me as Provincial Grand Summus.

I was born in 1945 into an RAF family that travelled with my father wherever he was posted, resulting in me attending 11 schools throughout England and in Germany and Australia. I left in 1963 with 11 'O' Levels and 4 'A' Levels and entered the RAF College Cranwell on a 3-year cadetship, graduating with a permanent commission as a Navigator. There followed flying tours on Canberras in Germany and Vulcans in Cyprus and the UK. I was lucky enough to then serve as the RAF Exchange Officer on the staff of Britannia Royal Naval College, Dartmouth. On promotion I returned to flying and supported the Vulcan missions to the Falklands. There then followed a series of ground tours in Germany and the UK until I took early retirement in 1996 to return to Cornwall to look after my ageing parents. I was appointed MBE in 1990.

In 1967 I married Gill and in the next 30 years we had 16 house moves, eventually settling in Cornwall. Our son works in the City and our daughter followed me into the RAF where she continues to serve as a Reserve Officer. While I was young and fit enough I enjoyed a range of sports: cricket, rugby, football, squash, offshore sailing, horse riding and clay pigeon shooting (I was RAF Skeet champion in 1994). I am also involved in game shooting and deer management.

My entry into Freemasonry was a little unusual. I was walking down the street in Cyprus when a passing colleague said 'I didn't know you were a Mason' 'I'm not' 'Sorry, I thought I saw your name in the Lodge minutes' 'That would be my father, he was in the Lodge 9 years ago when serving here. He visited it last month when he was on holiday with us' 'Oh, would you like to join?' 'Yes, why not?' And so, in March 1972 I was initiated into Apollo Lodge No 7886 UGLE in the District of Cyprus. I have maintained my membership ever since and try to plan our holidays to coincide with their meetings.

I left Cyprus while still a Fellow Craft and was raised by dispensation in my father's Mother Lodge, Duke of Cornwall No 1529, which I joined in 1977. Being so often on the move made advancing in Freemasonry difficult, but serving 11 of my last 14 years in the RAF in Germany proved the catalyst. First I joined the Mark, taking the chair in 1994, then the RAC (GLBFG, German Constitution), followed by the RAM. I took the chair in the Craft (GLBFG) in 1995. Settling in Cornwall in 1997 enabled me to become more involved in Freemasonry and I took the chair of a Craft Lodge under UGLE in 2006, 34 years after my initiation! I was also introduced to Progressive Orders that were not available in Germany so, in addition to taking the chair in Mark and RAM, and being appointed P.A.G.D.C. and R.A.M.G.R. respectively, I joined and progressed in OSM (P.A.G.D.C.), RSM (Dist.G.Rec., Dist.G.P.C.W. and now P.G.L.ect.), and AMD (G.I.G.). My interest in the historical and esoteric aspects of Freemasonry led me to join the Order of Athelstan (P.J.G.W.), The Operatives and SRIA (currently in the chair of both), and Pilgrim Preceptors where I am the Grand Marshal.

I joined The Derek Mortimore Conclave of the Western Counties in 2009 and was thus a Founding Member of Derek Mortimore Consistory 5TI when it was consecrated in 2010, and Kernow No 83 on its consecration in 2012, when the Province of the Western Counties was formed. We evolved into the Province of Devon & Cornwall in 2019 and since 2013 I have served as Prov.G.Rec. and Dep.Prov.G.S. I am extremely proud of having been appointed Provincial Grand Summus and am looking forward to the end of Covid restrictions when we will again be able to get together at all levels and continue our meetings in the friendly and supportive manner that characterises our Order.

The meeting was attended by many members of the Provincial Grand Senatus of Devon and Cornwall, and Provincial and District Grand Summi and Companions from the Provinces in England and Wales and Districts overseas.

By 11.00 a.m. just over 100 Companions had joined the meeting. Dist. Companion Kenneth Barrington Chalkley, *M.B.E.*, the Provincial Grand Summus Designate, declared the meeting open and welcomed all present and the Grand Summus, M.Dist.Comp. Ian Stanley Currans, addressed the Companions.



The Grand Summus requested the Grand Recorder, R.Dist.Comp. Ryan A Williams, to read the Patent of Appointment.



The Grand Summus then formally confirmed R.Dist.Comp. Companion Kenneth Barrington Chalkley, *M.B.E.*, as the Provincial Grand Summus for the Provincial Grand Senatus of Devon and Cornwall. The Provincial Grand Summus formally confirmed Dist. Comp. Trevor Conroy as Deputy Provincial Grand Summus of Devon and Cornwall and V.Dist. Comp Roger Frank Guest as Assistant Provincial Grand Summus.

The Provincial Grand Summus read the names of the Companions appointed to and promoted in Provincial Grand Rank. The Provincial Grand Summus congratulated those who have received appointment or promotion in the Provincial Grand Senatus of Devon and Cornwall and then addressed Provincial Grand Senatus.



The Provincial Grand Summus thanked everyone for attending and declared the meeting closed.

Marking Well on the Isle of Man

The Isle of Man has been fortunate to have had some respite from the Covid-19 pandemic thanks to the rigid border controls implemented by its Government that restricted travel to the Island to returning residents and certain key workers, all of whom had to undergo strict quarantine upon their arrival.

As a result they had two periods where all social distancing restrictions were lifted and Masonic activity was able to resume.

Sadly, they are currently experiencing community transmission of the virus which has once more resulted in the imposition of a 21 day circuit breaker lockdown in the hope that it can be eliminated again.

During the most recent resumption, the Peveril Lodge of Mark Master Masons No. 323 installed their new Master, Bro Trent Lambert into the Chair of Adoniram in succession to R.W.Bro. David Downie, P.G.J.W., the Past Grand Inspector of the Isle of Man.

The Installation took place in the presence of the Deputy Provincial Grand Master W.Bro. Mike Kelly and a nearly full turnout of the Provincial Grand Lodge Officers.

At the conclusion of the ceremony the Deputy Provincial Grand Master Mike Kelly presented 4 sets of positive pressure air hoods to St John Ambulance Director Gerry Jones and Community First Responder Neil Hazell.

One of the hoods is being modelled by Provincial Grand Master, R.W.Bro. Martin Blackburn, who as a St John Ambulance Community First Responder himself will also be using the Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) which was paid for by donations of over £4,000 from Isle of Man Mark Masons.

They are vital pieces of equipment to protect the responders from exposure to infection when resuscitating casualties and have already been in action.

As part of the its Covid-19 pandemic response the Isle of Man NHS Ambulance Service has rolled out this enhanced PPE to all of its front line staff.

The St John Ambulance Community First Responders in the South of the Island are funded through the historic Rushen Emergency Ambulance charity which received some very generous donations allowing them to equip their volunteers to the same standard.

The team that the Provincial Grand Master co-ordinates in the East of the Island were still using FFP3 face masks and when one of them was sent to a cardiac arrest and started CPR before the arrival of the 999 ambulance crew, this difference in the level of protection between the St John Ambulance volunteer undertaking CPR — which is classified in Covid-19 terms as a "high risk aerosol generating procedure" - and the paid responders, was very obvious and commented on by the family. Our Brethren reacted with very generous donations.

There are 7 St John Ambulance Community First Responders covering the East of the Island. The donations received from local Brethren have enabled the purchase of 4 sets which will provide 3 for the Eastern Responders and 1 set for the Northern Responders' fast response car.
