Introduction

The Grand Sovereign's Care for Children Fund was formed at the turn of the Millennium with the express intention and principle of using its assets for the relief and assistance of Children. Since then, it has donated over £344,000 to 150 worthwhile causes and charities that directly impact upon and improve the social, educational and personal well-being of Children throughout the world.

The Grand Sovereign's Care for Children Fund is expressly funded with donations from members of the Grand Imperial Conclave of the Masonic Order of The Red Cross of Constantine.

The Covid-19 Pandemic and the Fund

By April 2020, the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic was being felt across every aspect of our communities not least by children and those responsible for their care and welfare.

The Grand Sovereign, M.III.Kt. Graham Leslie Flight, G.C.C., was keen that the Order provided whatever support it could to community-based initiatives providing a safe environment for children that had been particularly badly affected. These included day units, hospices, residential homes and temporary care facilities for the children of front line key workers.

Intendants-General were asked to identify opportunities within their Divisions where the Fund may be able to provide grants to alleviate hardship arising from the impact of Covid-19 and assist with the continuation of the kind of care facilities outlined above.





West Yorkshire commissions a beautiful Sesquicentenary Jewel



In 1871 six Mark Lodges in West Yorkshire were constituted into a Province, and on 2nd August that year, under the Banner of Fearnley Lodge of Mark Master Masons No 58, W.Bro. Thomas Perkinton was installed as its first Provincial Grand Master "according to ancient usage and custom" by R.W.Bro. William Romaine Callender, Provincial Grand Master for Lancashire.

In 2021 West Yorkshire celebrates its 150th year and to mark the occasion has commissioned a special and very beautiful Sesquicentenary jewel, which has been warmly endorsed by Mark Grand Lodge. The

Jewel is currently on sale from the West Yorkshire Provincial Website at CLICK HERE⁶ with proceeds to the 2023 Mark Benevolent Fund Festival.

Today West Yorkshire hosts 44 Mark Lodges and all its members are entitled to wear the Jewel. It is also available for purchase outside the Province should anyone wish to own one or add it to their collection. Proceeds from the sale of the Jewel will go to a very worthy cause which is close to all our hearts, the Mark Benevolent Fund.

The Province hopes to celebrate its Sesquicentenary at a special Provincial Meeting later this year.

On Friday, 26 February, the Province of Essex hosted its third highly successful Zoom Talk.

This one was titled "A brief history of the Ancient and Honourable Degree of Royal Ark Mariners and matters relating to the flood"

70 Royal Ark Mariners members from the Province of Essex, and indeed around the world, with guest visitors from and including California, Europe, South Africa and the Philippines.

The Provincial Grand Master R.W.Bro. Terence D Sheern welcomed those attending and introduced Brian Vickers, described by some attendees as a "walking Masonic encyclopaedia" who then presented his extremely interesting talk. The presentation began with historical details recorded about the Ark and went through more recently discovered details of the Ark and of its location. Archaeological evidence has been found to confirm that the Flood did take place and it showed that the area of flood was proved to be more than 4000 square miles!

Brian brought the meeting right up to date with an explanation of how the RAM degree had evolved from early times. He explained the current structure and protocol.

With questions from many of the members present, Brian continued to entertain the meeting. An excellent talk which was described as "thought provoking" and extremely entertaining. The Provincial Grand Master thanked Brian for joining us and for presenting such an interesting discussion.

A lovely message of thanks


