A Message from our Provincial Grand Master

Brothers, we now have physical meetings planned for when the suspension of Mark Meetings in Surrey ends on Monday 21st June 2022.

The Surrey Province in March was set up at the time of the first suspension of Mark Meetings in Surrey with a view to regular communication with our members and I thank all those who put in so much work putting it together and executing it. I cannot believe we are now at issue 14. This month we have a contribution from a member on the Brothers in Law Luncheon Club and we will arrange you and your Lodge to send an article.

With our Provincial meeting dates, I was delighted that the Trustees of the MBF agreed a Major Grant to local Lodges, with £1,800 from each Mark Lodge in England and Wales. Full details have been sent to Lodge Secretaries.

It is now for the Lodge members in every Mark Lodge to nominate a representative to Surrey that they wish to support, the election process. It is being conducted by the Province by the Deputy Provincial Grand Secretary in the hope that there will be a fairly even distribution of the Grants to the right Lodges in Surrey.

Overall this amounts to a substantial donation to the Province amounting of £1.2m. This donation comes from the giving of Mark Master's Mission.

Our efforts for the 2022 MBF Festival continue and this month you will read of some of the events already undertaken and those planned. These include members of local or friendly Lodge holding their car boot sales, which raised £41k.

Last Sunday I was able to pay a visit to the meeting at Hook Road Area. My thanks and appreciation to those who gave assistance and their enthusiasm and I think they might do it again.

It seems times is willing to provide advice and assistance to other Lodges who consider that they could raise funds in this way.

Perhaps your Lodge is a little short of reaching the next MBF fundraising level and this could be a new way of raising the amount needed.

Alternatively, your Lodge may have other ideas for Lodge fund raising, perhaps a Lodge BBQ, or a tea party on a coffee morning, or even something more substantial.

In the short time that we have been fundraising the MBF have made substantial donations to good charities such as Hope for Tomorrow, St John Ambulance, Royal Warrant for the Firemen, as well as supporting members and their families, and many small charities in Surrey.



I now look forward to meeting as many of you as possible when our Lodges resume their activities. As at the events planned this summer. We must all remember that there is no pressure on any individual member to return to physical meetings before they are ready. Brothers in Law Luncheon Club



The Brothers in Law Luncheon Club formed over 60 years ago from a group of 12 police officers meeting at New Zealand Yard who were also Masons. They first gathered for a Christmas Lunch in December 1953 at Croxson and District Masonic Hall. This event became a tradition and led to the formation of the Luncheon Club in June 1966.

The Club grew in numbers and peaked at over 100 members. Currently we have 100 and have extended membership to all Masons who were or are serving warranted Police Officers and Special Constables with more than five years continuous service.

The annual membership fee was then £5, but that was raised to £10 in 2013. All money raised is donated to worthy causes. Over £7,000 has been distributed since 1980 and a sum is given to the dependents of fallen police officers killed in the course of their duties.

Significant sums have been donated to Fines Income (Police Recruitment Centre), Lifford, St Raphael's Hospital, ELPS, Croxson Village, Social Clubs, MESH, Royal National Foundation, WASH for Mares, the Surrey Mark 2022 MRF Festival and the Surrey BMX 2020 Festival.

Over the years the Provincial Grand Master, his Deputy and other members of the Surrey Craft and Mark Executive have become regular attendees at the City State Lunch. Other Surrey Lodges have also been well represented by their Affiliated Executive members.

The Club also has an annual Ladies Festival, which raises money for the Provincial Grand Master as well as a Summer Luncheon, following the AGM where the members and their guests can enjoy a relaxed meal.

A Message from Alan Brockwell

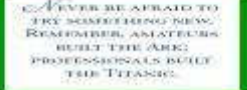
Mark brethren all, we are ready there and normally should return after the 21st of June.

It's in the Blood

Three years ago, the Mark Benevolent Fund donated a Dacia Duster to Blood Bikes Manchester for use as a response vehicle. The Duster, fleet name Mark, but known to the drivers as Mark Mason, has been in constant use since it was donated and has travelled some 48,000 miles supporting the NHS.



This vehicle, donated by the Mark Benevolent Fund, is regularly driven by a Mark Master Mason, Bro. The Rev. Robert Murphy, Junior Warden of Flixton Shepherd Eastwood Lodge 1173. Bro. Murphy, in addition to being Secretary of his craft Lodge and Secretary of a Masonic Hall Co. & Management Team, volunteered as a response driver for Blood Bikes Manchester, in his "free time".

His work as driver regularly takes him across four Masonic Provinces, West and East Lancashire, Cheshire, and Yorkshire West Riding, carrying Blood and Blood products from NHS Blood & Transplant centres to Hospitals.



Blood Bikes Manchester is a registered charity which offers an out of hours, free of charge, urgent medical courier service to the NHS. The service normally operates from 7.00 p.m. through to 6.00 a.m., and 24 hours at weekends and public holidays. However, since the start of the Pandemic our service has been operating 24/7. The call out and workload has increased ten-fold during this time and since the commencement of 2021 the service has carried out over 1,200 runs, or jobs, for the NHS.



Our riders are a hardy bunch that operate in all but the very worst weather, so as a backup we have a fleet of cars to take the place of our motorcycle if necessary. The additional demands, wear and tear and repairs costs placed on our motorcycles and cars has been exceedingly heavy.

The riders and drivers carry Blood and Blood Products, donor breast milk and frozen human milk from the Human Milk bank to Neonatal Intensive Care units for premature and sick babies across the region, urgent blood samples for analysis to regional Blood & Transplant centres, Covid samples & transplant samples.



Blood Bikes Manchester depends entirely on public sponsorship and donations to maintain a service. Fundraising is extremely important, as a charity we do not receive any form of payment for our service, so rely fully on donations from members of the public and sponsorship from local businesses. The Pandemic has seen a total stop on any fundraising throughout 2020 and into this year at a time when unfortunately, the charity needed additional funds to cover the additional demands placed on its resources.

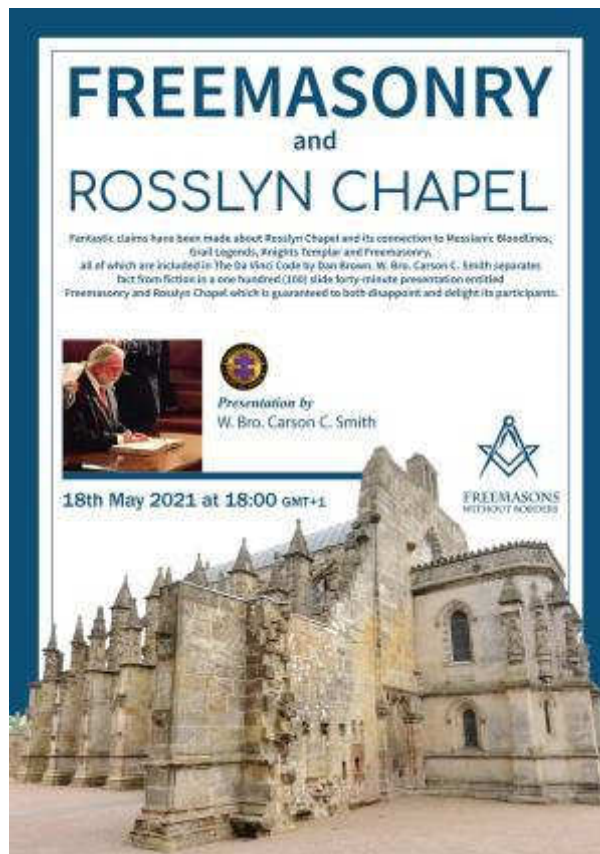

We reported recently that the new style MBF Festival Stewardship is aimed principally, but not exclusively, at members of each host Festival Province.

In return for a qualifying donation of £100, each Steward will be entitled to:

- A distinctive Stewards' breast jewel, year bar and pocket jewel holder.
- Inclusion of their name in the Festival Stewards' Roll of Honour in the Festival booklet
- And for individuals making their first donation under the scheme, qualification as a Life Governor of the Mark Benevolent Fund – the first step on the ladder of honorifics.

Monies raised by the take-up of Festival Stewardships will, of course, be included in each respective Festival total.

Helping to Combat Covid



At the start of Lockdown the Grand Secretary, R.W.Bro. Ryan A. Williams, P.G.J.W., shared the COVID Symptom Study²¹ app.
