Two exceptional Brethren

Congratulations to W.Bro. Prof. Marios Adamou O.B.E.

In the Queen's Birthday Honours list, Worshipful Brother Marios Adamou was presented with an O.B.E. (Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire). He received the Honour for his services to mental health, particularly his work relating to adult neurodevelopmental disorders, having established the largest NHS service in the UK, and his contribution to research in the field.



Marios was born in Cyprus, is married (his wife is also a Freemason) and has two Sons both of whom study at Queen Elizabeth Grammar School in Wakefield. He studied Medicine initially in Greece, then trained in Psychiatry in London, before moving to Yorkshire as a Consultant Psychiatrist working at South West Yorkshire Partnership NHS FT. He is also a Professor of Psychiatry at the University of Huddersfield.

His Craft Freemasonry began at The Brighouse Lodge No. 1301 being introduced through the Provincial introduction system. He was initiated on 20 April 2011, Passed and then Raised on 18 April 2012. He

became Worshipful Master of Brighouse Lodge in 2018 and 2019, and in 2019, he also joined Rastrick Lodge No. 4885 where he is currently Senior Warden.



His journey in the Mark began when he was introduced to R.W.Bro. Brian Morris Batty, Past Prov.G.M. Their relationship grew and he joined Brighouse Lodge of M.M.M. No. 753 who meet on a Monday. At his advancement Brian asked if the newly advanced Brother would like to attend a Meeting on the Saturday, yes was the answer and a place was found. This was the Appointment and Investiture of our current Prov.G.M., R.W.Bro. James Steggles.

He was Installed in the Chair of Brighouse Lodge of M.M.M. No. 753 on 11 February 2019.

His passion for Freemasonry is well illustrated by the fact that, in the ten years since he was initiated into Craft, he has joined several other orders, many where he has attained the Chair.

Combined, they make an impressive list of commitments indicative of a most committed Freemason who has a very infectious enthusiasm and who, when asked what his ambitions were in Freemasonry, responded, 'to continue to enjoy my membership and hope that others would be inspired to follow the lead'. Undoubtedly it is the commitment to the precepts of Mark Masonry that shines with Marios and the desire to demonstrate this in his daily life and actions; exactly what should be at the forefront of all our Masonic endeavours.

Finally, a reflection upon W.Bro. Marios by V.W.Bro. Dr Rod Taylor, Past.Asst.Prov.G.M. who said "With his strong academic background, Marios can well be described as a speculative Mason but despite his numerous qualifications, he has more degrees than a thermometer, he is not a distant, ivory tower intellectual, but a down to earth character who endears himself to his Brethren with his modest, humorous and sympathetic approach".

An evening's Masonry with Marios is always an enjoyable and memorable experience. He has heavy professional responsibilities not just locally, but regionally and nationally, and has had to work exceptionally hard during the coronavirus pandemic. We are all delighted that the endeavours of this

At the recent Virtual Business Meeting for the Red Cross of Constantine Division of Cumbria, the Intendant-General, R.III.Kt. Keith Beaumont, expressed his admiration for his Deputy Intendant-General, V.III.Kt. Joseph Sudhakar, P.G.H.Alm., with the following words:

"Worthy Knights, it was a delight to re-appoint my Deputy, V.III.Kt. Joseph Sudhakar who has, during these difficult times, made regular contact with me. Worthy Knights, I do feel it appropriate on all our behalf to thank Joe during this meeting. Most of you will be aware that my Deputy is an Consultant Orthopaedic & Trauma Surgeon in County Durham."

"When the first "Lockdown" was introduced, V.III.Kt. Joe remained at the Darlington Memorial Hospital taking care of Covid-19 patients while, at the same time, attending to emergency patients who had

suffered various bone injuries. He was unable to return to his home in Cumbria, as Darlington was in a different tier to his home. During the second "Lockdown" he remained at the hospital for seven months without returning home."

"As a consultant orthopaedic and trauma surgeon, V.III.Kt. Joe has been on call and has worked long hours seven days a week for most of the time restrictions were imposed. He is now able to go home to see his family once a fortnight but he is working extra hours to reduce his waiting list which has grown over the last year."

"He continues to work and support his colleagues during the Covid-19 pandemic making sacrifices, along with almost all of his colleagues in the NHS, for the good of patients."

Nine hour mountain rescue assisted by MBF funded drone



At the end of 2019 the MBF awarded £71,765 to the Lake District Mountain Search & Rescue for the purchase of 'Drone' packages to more effectively search for those in need. The charity covers the whole of the Cumbria area and the application was initiated by the Province of Cumberland and Westmorland.


As you can see from the archive photograph it is a grand affair that would have been preceded by a luncheon and concluding with tea and cakes on the vicarage lawn.
