

On Thursday, 2 September, The Most Eminent and Supreme Grand Master, Paul Raymond Clement, G.C.T., was pleased to attend a meeting of the Provincial Priory of Hertfordshire to Install Alastair David White as Right Eminent Provincial Prior. Alastair is well known within the Province and the Order, having been Provincial Vice-Chancellor for Hertfordshire since 2015.

The Grand Master was accompanied by the V.H. & R.E. Great Seneschal and a full team of Great Priory Officers.

The Grand Master was pleased to be back in Hertfordshire, a Province he has a long association with, and in his address to the Knights present he recollected previous visits during the tenure of past Provincial Priors, as well as highlighting the leading lights within the Orders history after whom some of the Preceptories are named.

The meeting was very well attended with plenty of support from Knights of the Province, as well as visiting Provincial Priors, Sub-Priors, Vice-Chancellors and Knights of the Order.

At the meal following the meeting a very generous donation of £2,700 was given by the Province to the Grand Master for the St John of Jerusalem Eye Hospital.

This was the first full team visit for the Knights Templar since pre-Covid times and it was very heartwarming to see the enthusiasm and usual esprit de corps amongst the Brother Knights present. It almost felt as if we'd never been away.

The Installation meeting of the Kent Installed Commanders Lodge held on Friday, 27 August 2021 at the Maidstone Masonic Centre played host to the Kent Provincial Grand Assembly of Royal Ark Mariners, chaired by the Provincial Grand Master R.W.Bro. Archibald Iain Torrance. This was a very special meeting as it was the last official duty of the Provincial Grand Master before he retires.

After the Lodge business had been taken care of, the Provincial Grand Master and members of the Provincial Executive entered and the Prov.G.M. occupied the Chair.



The Provincial Grand Master explained the purpose of the meeting and welcomed the visitors. After the Roll of Royal Ark Mariner Lodges within the Province was called the Provincial Grand Master presented lapel pins to the newly Elevated Brethren welcoming them into the Order. The recipients of Provincial Royal Ark Mariner Grand Rank were then invested.

The Provincial Grand Master presented Festival President's Awards of silver goblets to representatives of four Mark and Royal Ark Mariners Lodges thanking them for their support in donating the highest total or donating the highest per capita.



He also presented a number of Festival Awards.





The Provincial Grand Master then addressed Provincial Grand Assembly. In his address he presented Patents of Appointment to W.Bro. Perri Ahmet as Deputy Provincial Grand Master; and W.Bros., David Stiff and Martyn Summers as Assistant Provincial Grand Master.



He also presented a Past Assistant Provincial Grand Master collarette to W.Bro. Ian Gallehawk thanking him for all he has done for the Province over a number of years. Unfortunately VW.Bro. Fred Brown, Past Deputy Provincial Grand Master, was unable to attend so he will be presented with his collarette at a later date.

The Provincial Grand Master closed Provincial Grand Assembly and retired in procession with his Officers. After photographs and refreshments in the bar we sat down to a lovely meal at the Maidstone Masonic Centre.

In the reply to his toast the Provincial Grand Master thanked everyone for their support during his tenure as Provincial Grand Master of the Mark Province of Kent culminating with the Province and its many friends raising a record £2,057,000, and as a result qualifying as the very first MBF Grand Patron Diamond Province. A wonderful achievement.

At the end of his reply the Provincial Grand Master received a standing ovation — a fitting end to a very special day.


