Annual meeting of the Provincial Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of West Yorkshire



Saturday, 23 April 2022 and an excellent turnout by the Brethren and Guests saw the first Annual Provincial Meeting since 2019. After the Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies, Worshipful Brother Andrew Brown inculcated a few parish notices viz, turn off your mobile phone, proceedings begun firstly, with the receiving of the Distinguished Guests from a goodly number of fellow Provinces.

Past Rulers of the Province of West Yorkshire then gained admittance led by Past Provincial Grand Master, Right Worshipful Brother Jim Truswell, accompanied by Past Deputy Provincial Grand Masters, Very Worshipful Brethren Bob Corfield and Richard Puttrell and Past Assistant Provincial Grand Masters, Very Worshipful Brethren Dr. Rod Taylor and Trevor Bolton. Finally, the Provincial Grand Master, Right Worshipful Brother James Steggles, accompanied by the Deputy Provincial Grand Master, Very Worshipful Brother Alan Oldfield and the Assistant Provincial Grand Master, Very Worshipful Brother John Vause together with an Escort of the Provincial Grand Lodge Officers.

R.W.Bro. Jim then welcomed all present, particularly the distinguished visiting Brethren and advised that our past Provincial Grand Master, Right Worshipful Brother Brian Batty recently had surgery but is recovering and sends his good wishes to all, he was missed. Equally so was the Assistant Grand Master, Right Worshipful Brother Stephen Davison, a regular visitor to the Province and Honorary Member of two Lodges. Very sadly he had passed away earlier in the week and will most certainly be missed by all who knew him, most admired and respected, one who manifestly espoused and showed the precepts of the Order in his daily life and actions, a tragedy.

Provincial Grand Lodge was then opened, and the next item of business was to receive a Deputation consisting of all the Royal Ark Mariner Lodges in the Province to the tune of 'A Life on the Ocean waves' very appropriate. V.W.Bro. John Vause, A.Prov.G.M. then paid tribute to thirty-three departed Brethren, including R.W.Bro. Stephen and Very Worshipful Brother Robbie Scorer. The

Brethren stood to order in respect to departed merit. The Roll of all the Mark Lodges was then read, and apologies noted. Whereupon the Minutes of the last meeting, a virtual gathering, were approved.

In the absence due to illness of Very Worshipful Brother John Morgan, Provincial Grand Registrar, his report was delivered by the Provincial Grand Secretary, Worshipful Brother Gary Parker. The Mark Degree and Fraternity of Royal Ark Mariners have endured a trying period in the year to September 2021 due to the impact of the covid pandemic with one thousand and forty-eight members and six hundred and forty-two members respectively at the end of August last. However, things have definitely turned the corner and a significant improvement will be seen at the end of August 2022. The Treasurer, Worshipful Brother Alan Hines then presented his report showing, as expected, reduced revenues but also reduced expenditure giving rise to a surplus of one thousand nine hundred and forty-four pounds. The next item on the agenda was the appointment of the Treasurer where W.Bro. Alan was duly confirmed for a further year as was Worshipful Brother John Mitchell as Provincial Auditor.

The newly Appointed Provincial Grand Lodge Officers were then Invested with Worshipful Brother Richard Brown as Senior Warden, unfortunately absent due to illness, and Worshipful Brother John Madigan as Junior Warden, upon completion they received appropriate Salutations.

At the end of his address, the Provincial Grand Master for the Province of Yorkshire West Riding, Right Worshipful Brother James Newman stepped forward and presented a further cheque for twenty-five thousand pounds in respect of the West Yorkshire Mark Benevolent Fund Festival, making a total of one hundred and twenty-five thousand pounds. As R.W.Bro. Jim commented further evidence of the excellent relationship which exists between the Masonic Orders in the Province. The final item was a thank you to all those who had made the day possible, particularly the 'Host' Lodges. This was in the hands of the Dep.Prov.G.M., V.W.Bro. Alan who confirmed that we meet again on the 15 April 2023. Provincial Grand Lodge was closed.

Over two hundred Brethren sat down in what has affectionately become known as 'Hogwarts' to dine and enjoy each other's company. A remarkably busy, noisy, and enjoyable atmosphere as Brethren chatted away between bouts of taking turns to serve each other.

Toasts to The Queen and then The Grand Master, Most Worshipful Brother His Royal Highness Prince Michael of Kent G.C.V.O. were given by R.W.Bro. Jim.

It was then the turn of W.Bro. John the Junior Warden to give the toast to R.W.Bro. Jim. He did a fabulous job with only a small amount of notice given just days before. This was the first such toast in 3 years and he firstly wished a speedy recovery to W.Bro. Richard the Senior Warden. He thanked R.W.Bro. Jim on behalf of all the promoted and acting officers appointed today and hoped they could live up to the dynamic inspirational leadership shown by him. He said that he had led the way using such technology as zoom to keep us all afloat and in touch. Although he did remark that his microphone did not support such technology as he did occasional bouts of Norman Collier! And although many of us had a bit of Luddite running through their veins, we had all moved on and embraced things such as T@3 and Facebook during these covid times. The achievement of all Mark Lodges achieving Diamond award was remarkable and he was looking forward to all the forthcoming planned events.

He was glad both R.W.Bro. Jim and his wife Joan had managed to finally get to Tenerife this year for some sun and relaxation but said that since their departure the sun had been lacking. Finishing by

thanking him for all the challenging work, tremendous enthusiasm, and dedication he extended to our Province.

In his response R.W.Bro. Jim thanked W.Bro. John for his kind toast and wished W.Bro. Richard a speedy recovery and knew they would support each other along the way. He congratulated all on their appointments and said it would be a busy year ahead. But to make the most of it. Enjoy it because it would go extremely fast. He thanked our distinguished guests for their support as they had certainly enhanced our proceedings and hoped they would come again. He particularly thanked West riding Masonic Charities Ltd and Right Worshipful Brother James Newman for his support and the excellent relationship he shared with this Province. He also thanked all members of the Province for their support and asked for a final push for the Festival to make us all proud in 2023. He announced all the lucky winners of the 250 club and gave a final reminder of the MC2 cycle challenge and assorted items for sale on the website such as the hard back book charting the history of the Province. Closing by saying he hoped everyone had enjoyed a wonderful day out and wished all a safe journey home.

What a most enjoyable day and in the words of the late R.W.Bro. Stephen, more evidence of the 'Magic of the Mark.'



Provincial Priory of Northumberland's Church Service



Saturday saw the much anticipated return of the Northumberland Provincial Priory Church Service after a two year hiatus.

Knights, in full regalia, along with their wives and partners, from around the Province gathered at Hexham Abbey, as part of the Annual Meeting, to join in celebration. In addition it was the first time that those Knights who received Great Priory honours could get together, in an official capacity, to show off their finery.

Hexham Abbey is one of the earliest seats of Christianity in England. Since its beginning, it has witnessed periods of immense turmoil and change, across the region and within the English Church itself, many of which are reflected in the very fabric of the building today.

There has been a church on the site of the Abbey for more than 1,300 years, since Queen Etheldreda made a grant of lands to Wilfrid, Bishop of York c.674. Of Wilfrid's Benedictine Abbey, the Saxon crypt and apse still remain.

There have been additions made every century since Hexham Abbey was first founded. The oldest part is the Saxon crypt from 674 and the east end was rebuilt in 1860 to a John Dobson design, and the nave, whose walls incorporate some of the earlier church, was rebuilt in 1908.

During 2014, building work was completed on the £3m restoration of the medieval monastery complex at the Abbey to create a major visitor exhibition, function rooms and community meeting spaces. This is one of the most significant events in the Abbey's life, and it reunites all the buildings on site for the first time since the Reformation, when the monastic complex was removed by Henry VIII.



Since the Dissolution of the Monasteries in 1537 the Abbey has been the parish church of Hexham and today is a centre for worship and witness to the Christian faith. The oldest of the 10 bells was cast in 1742. The youngest two were installed for the Millennium.

After the service all present then attended Hexham Masonic Hall to avail themselves of a buffet luncheon and it was agreed that a very enjoyable day was had by all.





O.S.M. £1,000 donation to Durham Children's Charity



Support for a County Durham based children's charity was shown again today, Friday 20 May 2022, when the Order of the Secret Monitor presented a cheque for £1,000 to Henry Dancer Days on behalf of the members of Arbeia Conclave No. 296, which surrendered its Warrant in May 2021.

Commenting on the presentation, Wy. Bro. Robin Knight, Deputy Provincial Grand Supreme Ruler for the Province of Durham and Supreme Ruler of Arbeia Conclave at the time of its closure said:

"In Spring of 2021 I watched a local news article on Henry Dancer Days and was deeply moved by Henry's story and the inspiring work that his mum Jane has been doing through the charity she set up. In my capacity as Intendant General for the Division of Durham in the Red Cross of Constantine I made an application to the Grand Sovereigns Care for Children Fund, who promptly made a very generous grant of £2,500.

As we were at that time in the depths of Covid it was not possible to meet with Jane and make a formal presentation. The important thing was that the funds would do a great deal to assist in those challenging times.

A year on, mindful that recovery from Covid in the masonic world has been a slow-burn I felt charities might be experiencing a similar issue with funding levels. The Arbeia members had resolved that any remaining funds be used for charitable purposes and generously agreed to donate £1,000; and so, it is a delight to finally meet Jane today and make this further donation face to face."

Jane Nattrass, Henry's Mum and Charity Director said:

"As a small charity we couldn't continue to help the people we serve without support such as this. We are extremely grateful to the Grand Sovereign's Care for Children Fund and the Arbeia members.

Putting a smile on the faces of children with cancer and their families is at the heart of what we do. The funds we've been given will result in many."



At the meeting of Mark Grand Lodge at Freemasons' Hall on Tuesday, the Pro Grand Master, M.W. Bro. Raymond John Smith, announced that the Mark Benevolent Fund would be donating £25,000 to the Mark Inspectorate of Romania who have been working proactively in many ways to provide support and relief to their neighbours in Ukraine.

This tremendous endeavour has touched Freemasons across the Constitution and many of our Brethren are keen to add their own support by making a donation.

We have set up a Relief Chest with the M.C.F. under the name of the **Mark Emergency Relief Fund** and you can now make donations in a variety of ways.

We know that there is enormous support for this already. To make the administration of donations as smooth as possible, enabling funds to be transferred efficiently to where they are needed most, we ask that you note the following advice regarding donations:

For individual donations of less than £100 - please make arrangements with your Mark Lodge for these to be collected centrally and then for the Lodge to make one consolidated donation into the Fund. These consolidated donations will count toward the Lodge's M.B.F. honorifics, rather than each individuals.

[V.W.Bro. Cristian Mihutoiu, Grand Inspector for Romania has sent us details of the humanitarian activities he and his Brethren are developing for the Ukrainian refugees.](#)

1) ACCOMMODATION

For both refugees coming from the North by car and on foot, and those coming from the South by ferry, there are requirements for short term accommodation places for at least 3-4 days, after which some of them are travelling to other European countries while others are being hosted by Romanian families. For this purpose we are cooperating with the Government to supply the following facilities:

- special tents for more than 20 people

- electrical heating devices
- beds and blankets
- personal hygiene products

On the other hand, there are many small hotel owners which offer their facilities for the refugees asking in return for the payment for the utilities (gas, water, electricity).

2) MEDICAL SUPPLIES

- emergency kits
- small surgery kits
- antibiotics and other different medicines
- disinfecting solvents
- cleaning sets
- medical face masks

3) FOOD AND WATER SUPPLIES

- sandwiches
- warm food freshly prepared
- still water
- disposable plates and cups

4) TRANSPORTATION FROM THE BORDER TO DIFFERENT CITIES AND AIRPORT

Many Ukrainian refugees are leaving Romania after 3-4 days spent at the border, through the major airports, especially Bucharest. So they need free transportation.

5) SPECIAL PSYCHOLOGICAL CARE FOR CHILDREN AND MOTHERS

Small children and mothers are very shocked and need specialised psychological assistance to recover.

6) CLOTHES SUPPLIES

Collecting and storing clothes for adults and children and distributing to the refugees as well as specialised articles for children.

Additionally we face the problem with those refugees who are asking to stay in Romania and need integration, long term accommodation and integration in our society. Many of them speak only Ukrainian or Russian.

Please also note that in the first wave of refugees arriving in the past 10 days, most of them have some financial resources. But the second wave, starting next week, will be those with very poor resources and who will require better care and support.

As of Wednesday, more than 250,000 refugees crossed the Romanian border and we are expecting up to 1 million in the next 30 days or less.

We are developing different support programs including in cooperation with other important organisations such as our National Craft Grand Lodge and international charity organisations such as LIONS Romania.

This is a brief presentation of our activities in support of the Ukrainian refugees who are facing a dramatic situation at the Romanian borders.

We are living in difficult times which require us, more than ever, and out of compassion and unity, to help those in difficult situations. Brotherhood and friendship must prevail.














We reported recently that the new style MBF Festival Stewardship is aimed principally, but not exclusively, at members of each host Festival Province.
