

A Magic Mark Investiture Meeting



It was heartwarming to see the Grand Temple at Freemasons' Hall so full at Tuesday's Mark Annual Investiture Meeting, the first since 2019.

Most Worshipful Brother Raymond John Smith, Pro Grand Master was presiding and opened the meeting, welcoming Brethren who had travelled from far and wide to attend and support their friends receiving Active Grand Rank or first appointment to Past Grand Rank.

Although the reading of the names of some of those Grand Officers who the Great Overseer of the Universe has called to higher service is always a sad occasion, this year was especially poignant following the loss of our Assistant Grand Master, R.W.Bro. Stephen Davison, to whom the Pro Grand Master paid a personal and warm tribute before indicating that the Assistant Grand Master's Chair had been left empty as a sign of respect.

After most of the administrative business had been carried out it was time to Proclaim the Grand Master, Most Worshipful Brother HRH Prince Michael of Kent, *GCVO*. This fell to the Grand Director of Ceremonies designate, Christopher Davies, who wasted no time stamping his authority on proceedings, delivering the Proclamation in a very impressive manner. Chris is well known to many as the Grand Director of Ceremonies of the Order of the Secret Monitor and we wish him well in this new role.

Then came the appointment, obligation, investiture, installation and proclamation of the new Assistant Grand Master, R.W.Bro. Francis Charles Spencer. Frank is another well known face, being the outgoing Grand Director of Ceremonies of this Order (and Past Provincial Grand Master for Worcestershire) and Deputy Grand Summus of the Scarlet Cord.



Following this, over 300 recipients of Grand Rank were appointed and invested. Our congratulations to all of you. We hope you each enjoy your new Rank.

A few more items of admin were then dealt with before the Pro Grand Master addressed the Brethren. In his speech he reminded Brethren that our Grand Master, Prince Michael of Kent, will not only celebrate his eightieth birthday in July of this year, but is also celebrating 40 years as our Grand Master. We hope to welcome the Grand Master at the September meeting.

Following the return to Mark Masonry and having caught up with most of the outstanding business put on hold during the Covid pandemic, the time is now right to turn our attention to welcoming more Brethren into our wonderful and friendly Degree. The Pro Grand Master announced a new initiative entitled 'The Magic of The Mark' which was being launched that afternoon.

Each person dining in the Connaught Rooms after the meeting would find on their place setting a business card with a QR code and a website link that would take them to a new information video aimed at Freemasons yet to discover The Magic of The Mark. This can be shared with anyone who may be interested in joining the Mark. The video has been put together by the Recruitment, Retention and Reinvigoration Working Party with invaluable input from the Mark Province of West Yorkshire.

Thomas Firth Jackson 50 years in the Mark

On the 20th May 2022, the Mark Province of West Lancashire was honoured with a visit by The Pro Grand Master Most Worshipful Brother Raymond John Smith who was attending The Lawrence Lodge of Mark Master Masons. The Lawrence Mark Lodge were meeting to celebrate 50 years of

Mark Masonry in Lawrence Mark Lodge, of Right Worshipful Brother Thomas Firth Jackson Past Grand Junior Warden.

The Lodge was opened at 6.00 p.m. by The Lodge Worshipful Master and after the usual preliminaries, and on a report, The Right Worshipful Provincial Grand Master Brother Keith Alan Beardmore was escorted into the lodge room. He was welcomed into the Lodge by The Worshipful Master and offered the gavel which on this occasion he graciously accepted. After the salutations and on another report The Pro Grand Master Most Worshipful Brother Raymond John Smith was escorted into the Lodge with The Grand Director of Ceremonies, Grand Sword Bearer and Grand Standard Bearer. He was welcomed by The Provincial Grand Master and escorted to his seat and was then afforded salutations to which he suitably responded.

Prior to the main item on the agenda, due to the untimely passing to the Grand Lodge above, a Memoriam for Right Worshipful Brother Stephen Davison Assistant Grand Master was observed. The Brethren stood in respect of departed merit.



The Lodge was called off to allow non-Mark Master Masons (for the moment) to enter the Lodge and join the celebration of the celebrant, who of course is well known in Chorley Masonic Hall. The Provincial Grand Master asked for Right Worshipful Brother Jackson P. G. J. W to be presented to him. The Provincial Grand Master invited Brother Jackson to occupy the Master's Chair and was escorted to the West from where he prefers to deliver the address, this being his idea as a better

situation than the celebrant sitting in front of the Master's Pedestal with the Brethren looking at the back of the celebrant's head. Over halfway through the address Brother Jackson said "That's enough" but before acceding to his request the Provincial Grand Master had to mention that Brother Jackson is The Most Worshipful Grand Master over the Allied Masonic Degrees of England and Wales and Districts and Councils Overseas. A certificate was read from Provincial Grand Lodge congratulating Brother Jackson on achieving 50 years in Mark masonry. Right Worshipful Brother Jackson vacated the Master's Chair and The Provincial Grand Master re-occupied it.



Two Chairs were placed in the middle of the Lodge, one facing North and one South, and the Pro Grand Master invited Brother Jackson to join him where they sat opposite each other and commenced an interesting and at times witty resumé of Brother Jackson's life; sort of 'Head-to-Head.' Before returning to his seat The Pro Grand Master said he happened to have a communication for Brother Jackson and invited him to read it aloud. Brother Jackson said he only needs to read 'Promotion to Senior Grand Warden.' The Brethren received that terrific news with acclamation.

A brace of half centuries at Bronte Lodge of Royal Ark Mariners No. 535



It was a fabulous night at Bronte Lodge of R.A.M. on Thursday 19 May 2022. The meeting was to celebrate not only the Lodge being consecrated 50 years ago, the actual date being 10 September 1971, but also to celebrate and present Worshipful Brother Keith Hardwick Trott certificates for 50 years being a Royal Ark Mariner, actually being Elevated on 29 October 1971. The Lodge was opened in the usual manner after which the Provincial Grand Master R.W.Bro. James Steggles, G.M.R.A.C., entered and was offered the gavel naturally in Italian by the Worshipful Commander W.Bro. Enrico A. Venettuoli. R.W.Bro. Jim clearly understood what W.Bro. Enrico had said as he briefly took the gavel and quickly returned it saying in perfect English he really was looking forward to an excellent evening.

Worshipful Brother John Sharman then read the minutes of the consecration meeting from 1971. The then Provincial Grand Master, Right Worshipful Brother Carl Whitehead, performed the consecration and the then Assistant Provincial Grand Master, Worshipful Brother John Stanley Richardson, installed the Commander designate, Worshipful Brother Albert Connolly. W.Bro. Keith who was a very young founding member then gave a short history of the Lodge. R.W.Bro. Jim then

presented a 50-year Celebratory Warrant to W.Bro. Enrico and gave his many congratulations to the Lodge.

R.W.Bro. Jim then stood and gave a brief background to life in 1970/71. Edward Heath was the Prime Minister, Richard Nixon the President of the U.S.A., the Boeing 747 Jumbo Jet took its first maiden flight, the Twin Towers were completed, petrol was at 33p a gallon, a pint of beer just 20p, and the average price of a house being £5000 to name but a few.

W.Bro. Keith then joined him on the floor, and they talked about his very busy life and the love and respect that people had for him. He had been initiated into the craft in 1963 and, held high rank in Craft, Chapter and many other orders. He had also been a founding member and President of the B&D.I.M.A. He had trained as an electrical engineer but actually worked in mechanical design and eventually became sales and marketing director of the Rustless Iron Co.Ltd. in Keighley. They talked about his wife Pat who he married in 1955 and had been together for 47 years and the wonderful support she had given him. Other things they talked about were his membership of Keighley Lions for over 60 years where he had been President twice. And him being appointed director of Keighley and District Association for the Blind now called Sight Airedale. A very busy man to say the least!

W. Bro.Keith was then presented with a Grand Lodge 50 year certificate by his very close friend Worshipful Brother John Boocock and then being presented with a Provincial Grand Lodge 50 year certificate by R.W.Bro. Jim.

All business being dealt with the Lodge was closed and the Brethren retired to a fabulous festive board. Various toasts were given with Bro. Billy Light leading the way, liking R.W.Bro. Jim to Roy Castle in that he had dedication and was a record breaker! R.W.Bro. Jim responded saying Bro. Billy would indeed go far! Going on to talk about the Festival and the final push needed. Tickets for the Festival Finale on Saturday 1 July 2023 would go on sale this coming 4 July 2022. Brethren it will be a fabulous event. Book early!

The toast to the founding members was of course given by W.Bro. Keith who mentioned those wonderful founders – 17 in total and how far Bronte had come in that time. The oldest Mark and RAM Lodges in New Zealand resume work



On 25 May 2022, the District Grand Master, R.W.Bro. Farouk Khan, was delighted to preside at back to back meetings at which Lewis Lodge of M.M.M. No. 49 and Lebanon Lodge of R.A.M. No. 49 resumed work and a new Master and a new Commander were installed.

The Lewis Lodge No. 49 started working in New Zealand in 1872 in Greymouth on the West Coast of the South Island, having previously met briefly in Melbourne, Australia. Faced with closure in Greymouth, due to the depressed local economy and shrinking population, in 1999 the Lodges moved to Auckland where they met briefly as daylight lodges for older Brethren until going into abeyance in 2018.

With a resurgence of the English Craft in Auckland, there was increased interest in the Mark and the opportunity was seized to re-open the Lodges with the aim of appealing to the newer, younger members of the Craft. Both Lodges already have candidates.

The opening was attended by not only by senior members of the District but also by representatives of the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapters of New Zealand and Ireland.

A4S - Bedford Youth Charity Awarded £20,456 by MBF



Representatives of the Province of Northampton, Huntingdon and Bedford joined Mark Masons' Hall's Charities Manager at the A4S charity (Angling for Success – also known as ProgressAbility.org) based in Bedford.

The Trustees of the Mark Benevolent Fund awarded £20,456 to the charity for a vehicle to collect children from their homes in the surrounding counties and get them to the Bedford based centre and other activity centres. Many of these families do not have their own transport and rely heavily on the services the charity provides. A4S offers the provision of educational, training, mentoring and counselling services for those of all ages and backgrounds within the surrounding areas who have need of such facilities by reason of their social and economic circumstances. The centre in Bedford currently has 27 students attending mainly one day every week, for up to 10 weeks. Offering courses in angling and fish care, woodwork and carpentry, cooking and camping, each student is coached by highly professional and qualified staff. Professional qualifications can even be achieved by the students.




















At the meeting of Mark Grand Lodge at Freemasons' Hall on Tuesday, the Pro Grand Master, M.W. Bro. Raymond John Smith, announced that the Mark Benevolent Fund would be donating £25,000 to the Mark Inspectorate of Romania who have been working proactively in many ways to provide support and relief to their neighbours in Ukraine.

This tremendous endeavour has touched Freemasons across the Constitution and many of our Brethren are keen to add their own support by making a donation.

We have set up a Relief Chest with the M.C.F. under the name of the **Mark Emergency Relief Fund** and you can now make donations in a variety of ways.

We know that there is enormous support for this already. To make the administration of donations as smooth as possible, enabling funds to be transferred efficiently to where they are needed most, we ask that you note the following advice regarding donations:

For individual donations of less than £100 - please make arrangements with your Mark Lodge for these to be collected centrally and then for the Lodge to make one consolidated donation into the Fund. These consolidated donations will count toward the Lodge's M.B.F. honorifics, rather than each individual.

Donations of £100 or more may be made by individuals directly into the fund and will count towards the Brother's M.B.F. Honorifics

[V.W.Bro. Cristian Mihutoiu, Grand Inspector for Romania](#) has sent us details of the humanitarian activities he and his Brethren are developing for the Ukrainian refugees.

1) ACCOMMODATION

For both refugees coming from the North by car and on foot, and those coming from the South by ferry, there are requirements for short term accommodation places for at least 3-4 days, after which some of them are travelling to other European countries while others are being hosted by Romanian families. For this purpose we are cooperating with the Government to supply the following facilities:

- special tents for more than 20 people

- electrical heating devices
- beds and blankets
- personal hygiene products

On the other hand, there are many small hotel owners which offer their facilities for the refugees asking in return for the payment for the utilities (gas, water, electricity).

2) MEDICAL SUPPLIES

- emergency kits
- small surgery kits
- antibiotics and other different medicines
- disinfecting solvents
- cleaning sets
- medical face masks

3) FOOD AND WATER SUPPLIES

- sandwiches
- warm food freshly prepared
- still water
- disposable plates and cups

4) TRANSPORTATION FROM THE BORDER TO DIFFERENT CITIES AND AIRPORT

Many Ukrainian refugees are leaving Romania after 3-4 days spent at the border, through the major airports, especially Bucharest. So they need free transportation.

5) SPECIAL PSYCHOLOGICAL CARE FOR CHILDREN AND MOTHERS

Small children and mothers are very shocked and need specialised psychological assistance to recover.

6) CLOTHES SUPPLIES

Collecting and storing clothes for adults and children and distributing to the refugees as well as specialised articles for children.

Additionally we face the problem with those refugees who are asking to stay in Romania and need integration, long term accommodation and integration in our society. Many of them speak only Ukrainian or Russian.

Please also note that in the first wave of refugees arriving in the past 10 days, most of them have some financial resources. But the second wave, starting next week, will be those with very poor resources and who will require better care and support.

As of Wednesday, more than 250,000 refugees crossed the Romanian border and we are expecting up to 1 million in the next 30 days or less.

We are developing different support programs including in cooperation with other important organisations such as our National Craft Grand Lodge and international charity organisations such as LIONS Romania.

This is a brief presentation of our activities in support of the Ukrainian refugees who are facing a dramatic situation at the Romanian borders.

We are living in difficult times which require us, more than ever, and out of compassion and unity, to help those in difficult situations. Brotherhood and friendship must prevail.














We reported recently that the new style MBF Festival Stewardship is aimed principally, but not exclusively, at members of each host Festival Province.
