HRH Prince Michael of Kent, *G.C.V.O.* But, given the distances many had already committed to travel, and the amount of accommodation that had been booked by Brethren wishing to ensure themselves a timely arrival at the meeting, it was decided that the show must indeed go on.

And what a show it proved to be.



M.W.Bro. Raymond John Smith, the outgoing Pro Grand Master, had kindly agreed to preside over the meeting and represent the Grand Master for the Installation of all three new Rulers.

He was welcomed into the Grand Temple with warm and rousing applause and settled into the Presiding Officer's chair to open Grand Lodge and commence the business of the day.

The Grand Chaplain V.W.Bro. The Rev. Justin Parker, delivered two special prayers, one for Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, the other for our new King, Charles III, and the Brethren stood to Order in quiet and solemn reflection.

Following other items of administrative business, M.W.Bro. Smith proceeded to Install our three new Rulers:

As Pro Grand Master - M.W.Bro. John Herbert Prizeman



As Deputy Grand Master – R.W.Bro. Francis Charles Spencer



As Assistant Grand Master - R.W.Bro. Professor Denovan Keith Wilson



Following these Installation, M.W.Bro. Prizeman took the Chair and invested all those Brethren inattendance who had been promoted this year in Mark Grand Rank.



In his closing remarks, M.W.Bro. Prizeman paid tribute to the Grand Master, who would have be en celebrating his 40th Anniversary as our Grand Master at this meeting, before going on to read the address the Grand Master had prepared.

The meeting was then closed but there was one last duty to be performed. We had been joined in the Grand Temple by fanfare trumpeters from the London Banqueting Ensemble who had played the fanfares following the salutations to our Rulers.

As Brethren were called to Order, the trumpeters launched into the Gordon Jacob fanfare introduction to the National Anthem, before Grand Organist, Mario Rizzardi, took the lead on Freemasons' Hall's 1933 Willis Organ.

There aren't many places in England where you can hear such a large gathering of all male voices sing the National Anthem and Brethren were in particularly strong voice for this first massed singing of God Save The King, something which truly made the hairs in the back of the neck stand up.



As Brethren made their way into dine in the Grand Hall at the Connaught Rooms, there was an opportunity to purchase one of the specially manufactured commemorative Mark tokens, minted for the 40th Anniversary of our Grand Master, with his image on one side, and the Arms of Grand Lodge on the other.

For those not able to be present, they are now available via the Shop at Mark Masons' Hall at a cost of £10 each.



During the very enjoyable meal, we were accompanied by the London Banqueting Ensemble's full seven-piece orchestra who played a variety of tunes from their repertoire, with the Henry Wood 'Hornpipe from the Fantasia on British Sea Songs' getting some very enthusiastic audience participation.

They rounded off their performance with two of the Trumpeters descending from the Minstrel's Gallery to challenge each other in the Post Horn Gallop.



The formalities concluded with the Toast to The King, proposed by M.W.Bro. Prizeman. The R.W.Bro. Frank Spencer proposed the Toast to our new Pro Grand Master, who was keen to respond, thanking everyone for making the effort to attend and dine at such an emotional time, when the Nations focus is elsewhere.

He then retired from the Grand Hall to loud and appreciative applause and Brethren remained to talk and enjoy catching up with each other before making their various ways home.

We look forward to being back for the Annual Assembly of Royal Ark Mariner in December.

A new Grand Master for the K.B.H.C.



Arriving at Mark Masons' Hall on Thursday, 8 September, no one could have foreseen what a momentous day this would become. Before news of the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II had been announced, Knights of the Order of Knights Beneficent of the Holy City had gathered in the Grand Temple, not only to enjoy the Installation of the new Most Eminent and Reverend Grand Master, Dr Vivian Thomas, *JP*, but also to say a fond farewell to the outgoing Grand Master, Michael Edward Herbert, Presiding Officer, who was retiring after 11 years at the helm of this small and select Christian Order of Freemasonry.



M.Em. & Revd. Kt. Herbert opened the meeting and took care of the first items of administrative business before investing with Honour and Dignity of Knight Grand Cross of the Holy City, Robert Anthony Henry Morrow, Grand Herald; and Knight Commander of the Holy City, Graham Leslie Flight, Grand Treasurer.

M.Em. & Revd. Kt. Herbert then delivered a valedictory address, giving some historical insight into the origins of the Order and the English Constitution, before paying tribute to those he has enjoyed working closely with over the past 11 years.

He saved his final remarks to give a forecast about his successor, saying we will be "led by a firstclass Grand Master who will be supported by a superb team. This will ensure that the Order prospers, and happiness will shine throughout the Order." The address was received by a standing ovation and lengthy applause.

The Installation then commenced and Dr Vivian Thomas, *JP*, was placed in the Chair as the new Most Eminent and Reverend Grand Master. He thanked M.Em. & Revd. Kt. Herbert for the way in which he had been Installed and his many years of service and devotion to our Order.

Few could have failed to be impressed by the dignity with which M.Em. & Revd. Kt. Herbert then processed out of the Grand Temple, unaccompanied, but to tremendous applause. As the doors closed behind him M.Em. & Revd. Thomas commented that this way of bidding farewell to a Past Ruler is one of great poignancy and emotion.

However, as is the way, it was straight back down to business and the Installation of the Grand Prior & Deputy Grand Master, R.Revd.Kt. Dr John L.W. Wright, G.C.H.C., another devoted servant of the Order who has held this Office since 2014.



And then, one further high-profile appointment, a new Regional Grand Prefect for Avalon, Adrian Thorogood Jones, who succeeds R.Revd.Kt. Barry Desmond Burridge in command of this Prefecture which covers the Knights Templar Provinces of City & County of Bristol, Devonshire & Cornwall, Dorset & Wiltshire, Gloucestershire & Herefordshire, Hampshire & Isle of Wight, Monmouth & South Wales, Somerset and Worcestershire.

We then moved to the appointment and investiture of the Grand Officers of the Year, Promotions in, and First Appointments to, Grand Rank.

In his closing address, Dr Viv Thomas paid tribute to his predecessor and set out some of his plans for the future of the Order.

The Knights then retired to the dining room to enjoy the after proceedings, before the terrible news of the passing of Her Majesty broke later that afternoon.

A new Provincial Prior for Sussex

Brethren of the Province of Sussex and their guests started arriving at the Sussex Masonic Centre, Brighton, from 8.30 a.m.

On arrival we were greeted with coffee and bacon butties in true Sussex hospitality. Meanwhile, up in the Temple, rehearsals were underway for the installation of a new Provincial Prior.



The installation ceremony was conducted by the Most Eminent & Supreme Grand Master, Paul Raymond Clement, G.C.T., in a very sincere manner. He was most ably assisted by his team of Great Officers, including the Great Marshal, Tim Wheeler.



The Installing Officer and his Assisting Officers entered in procession under an Arch of Steel.



The Installing Officer ascended his throne, appointed his Officers, opened a Chapter of Provincial Priory, and was saluted under the direction of the Great Marshal. The banners of the Preceptories were paraded and the Roll of Preceptories called.



The Installing Officer then addressed the Knights on the purpose of the Meeting. The Great Marshal informed the Installing Officer that the Provincial Prior nominate, V.E.Kt. Colin Dann, P.Gt.Reg., was in attendance and requested to be Installed.



The Installing Officer directed that the Provincial Prior nominate be introduced in due form. The Great Marshal formed an escort, and the Provincial Prior nominate was introduced into the Chapter room under an Arch of Steel, preceded by the escort bearing the regalia on cushions.



The Installing Officer demanded to see the Patent of Appointment and directed that it be read. The Installing Officer then addressed the Provincial Prior nominate and enquired if he was ready and willing to undertake the duties of the Office.

The Great Prelate offered a prayer and the Provincial Prior nominate knelt and recited his Obligation. The Great Prelate raised the Provincial Prior nominate and conducted him to the East. The Provincial Prior nominate knelt and paid due homage to the M.E. & Supreme Grand Master, following which he was Invested and Installed.

The Great Prelate pronounced the Benediction, and the banner of the Province was placed in the East. The R.E. Provincial Prior was proclaimed from the West by the Great Herald and was saluted under the direction of the Great Marshal.

The Deputy Great Marshal then informed the Right Eminent Provincial Prior that the Provincial Sub Prior nominate E.Kt. Antony Craig (Tan) Rusby, P.Gt.A.-de-C., was in attendance and requested to be installed.



The Right Eminent Provincial Prior directed that the Provincial Sub Prior nominate be introduced in due form. The Deputy Great Marshal formed an Escort and the Provincial Sub-Prior nominate was introduced into the Chapter Room under an Arch of Steel, preceded by the escort bearing the Regalia on cushions.





The Provincial Prior demanded to see the Patent of Appointment and directed that it be read. The Right Eminent Provincial Prior addressed the Provincial Sub-Prior nominate and enquired if he was ready and willing to undertake the duties of the Office. The Great Prelate offered a prayer and the Provincial Sub-Prior nominate knelt and recited his Obligation. The Great Prelate raised the Provincial Sub-Prior nominate and conducted him to the East.

The Provincial Sub-Prior nominate knelt and paid homage to the Right Eminent Provincial Prior following which he was Invested and conducted to his seat. The Great Prelate pronounced the Benediction. The Provincial Sub-Prior was proclaimed by the Great Herald and saluted by the Knights of the Province under the direction of the Deputy Great Marshal.

The Great Marshal requested the Right Eminent Provincial Prior to confirm the appointment of Provincial Officers and replaced the Officers of the Installing Team by Provincial Officers.

The Right Eminent Provincial Prior addressed the Installing Officer thanking him and his team for such a wonderful ceremony. The Templars Hymn was sung while Alms were collected in aid of the St. John of Jerusalem Eye Hospital.

The Installing Officer retired under an Arch of Steel accompanied by the Officers of the Installing Team.



After the regular business of Provincial Priory had been concluded the Right Eminent Provincial Prior closed the Chapter of Provincial Priory and the first verse of the National Anthem was sung.



The Right Eminent Provincial Prior retired in procession under an Arch of Steel and greeted the honoured guests as they retired.


R.W.Bro. Robert received a field Appointment and was Promoted to Past Grand Senior Warden.

Remember Oscar Grainger? Of course you do! Oscar celebrated his 9th birthday this week!

At 18 months Oscar was diagnosed with Spastic Diplegic Cerebral Palsy. This means Oscar has increased muscle tone in his legs which causes stiffness and difficulty with movement, coordination and balance. He uses specialised equipment and has daily physio to help him be come more independent.

It was advised that Oscar is a good candidate for a procedure called Selective Dorsal Rhizotomy (SDR). Without this life changing surgery Oscar will most likely need more invasive surgery as he grows, and he could lose more of his independence. Back in 2019 the Mark Benevolent Fund, along with the Province of Devonshire stepped in to help, awarding his family with £6,000 for specialist equipment for his.
