## At the Great Priory of Malta



Knights of the Masonic Knights Templar Order of Malta, arrived at Freemasons' Hall on Tuesday for the annual Chapter of the Order of Malta.

This is one of the few 'Grand' annual meetings when a ceremony, with a Candidate, is worked in full. So there was much anticipation in the air as the Knights began to assemble wearing their distinctive regalia, emblazoned with the Maltese Cross, associated with the arrival of Knights on that Island in the sixteenth century.

The Most Eminent and Supreme Grand Master, Paul Raymond Clement made some introductory remarks before handing over to the Great Prior of Malta, R.E.Kt. Jonathan Whitaker, *JP*, K.C.M., who opened the meeting.

After some administrative business the M.E. & S. Grand Master was pleased to confer the honour and dignity of Knight Commander of the United Orders on three recipients, R.E.Kt. Raymond Ewen Flight, Provincial Prior for Zimbabwe (who was unable to join us for the meeting), R.E.Kt. David Frederick Coombes, P.Prov.Prior for Hampshire and Isle of Wight, and R.E.Kt. W.J.T. 'Toby' Pratt, P.Prov.Prior for Sussex.

Once this trio of worthy recipients had been proclaimed the Great Prior of Malta invited the Great Sub-Prior of Malta, V.E.Kt. Steven Warwick; the acting Great Prelate, E.Kt. Rev. Dr Simon Thorn; and a Deputy Great Mareschal, E.Kt. Kelvin Gane, to retire to communicate the Degree of Knight of St Paul to the Candidate, Knight Jonathan Paul Burnell of the Province of Nottinghamshire,



Whilst this ritual was being delivered in the vestibule, the M.E. & S. Grand Master proceeded to invest his Officers, and those receiving Promotions and First Appointments to Great Malta Rank.

And then it was time for the Candidate to be introduced to the meeting, challenged by the Banner Guards, and proceed through the ceremony of Installation, delivered to the usual high standard by the Great Prior of Malta and his team.

After the address on the history of the Order and its bearing on our ceremonies by the Great Prior of Malta, the M.E. & S.Grand Master rose to address the meeting.

He commented on the colour and spectacle of the Malta Ceremony and congratulated the Great Prior of Malta and assisting Officers on the quality of their work, and the Candidate on receiving the Degree.

He also gave his own short history lesson on the Masonic side of the Order.

This was followed by congratulations to the three new Knights Commander, and a welcome to the two Provincial Priors Installed since the Great Priory meeting in May, R.E.Kt. Colin Dan (Sussex) and R.E.Kt. Paul Davis (Somerset).

It was then time to welcome heads of other Masonic Orders and visitors from overseas.

The M.E. & S. Grand Master then made reference to the memorial service being held the following Tuesday to honour the commitment and devotion of our Past Grand Master, Timothy John Lewis.

E.Kt. Paul Swinge of the Province of Essex was thanked and congratulated on painting the splendid new Orle which had been used at the Octagonal Table for this ceremony and would now be used by Great Priory whenever the Malta Degree was being conferred.



Lastly, the M.E. & S. Grand Master gave a brief report on his recent visit to the St John of Jerusalem Eye Hospital where he opened the newly refurbished Children's Ward which had been funded by Great Priory. A superb landmark in our 106 year association with the Eye Hospital.

In closing, he made reference to the fact that we would shortly be singing Praise My Soul The King Of Heaven, a hymn played at the Wedding of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, whose passing we had marked at the start of the meeting. He then gave his best wishes to all Knights of the Order, their families and loved ones, for a happy and peaceful Christmas, before he handed back to the Great Prior of Malta to close the meeting and the Knights departed for refreshment.

# 100 years Knaresborough Castle Lodge



A great night at Knaresborough Castle Lodge of Mark Master Masons No. 768 on Friday, 11 November 2022. A busy night with over sixty in attendance. Great ceremonial, conducted with the Provincial Grand Master Right Worshipful Brother James Steggles leading the way.

Once R.W.Bro. Jim had been given a warm welcome from the Worshipful Master W.Bro. Tom Wilson and offered the gavel, which of course was accepted, he then appointed his own team, and the work began. Commencing with the salutations which, with the presence of the Deputy Provincial Grand Master V.W.Bro. Alan Oldfield and several past rulers were many. The noise being so loud and constant it could probably have been heard in Harrogate, four miles down the road! Apologies were given for the Assistant Provincial Grand Master, V.W.Bro. John E. Vause, who was in Romania with The Grand Master and other dignitaries where a new Mark District was being formed.

R.W.Bro. Jim explained the Lodge was consecrated on 16 September 1922 and would be celebrated in style tonight. Extracts from the minutes of the consecration were read followed with an insight into the history of the Lodge which W.Bro. Brian Ward Price was pleased to deliver. The Centenary Warrant delivered, and the Centenary Jewels presented it was time for the Provincial Grand Chaplain, W.Bro. Roger Quick, to deliver an oration which as always was done in style and presented with humour. R.W.Bro. Jim commenting afterwards that perhaps Roger was getting into the swing of things now and deserved a huge round of applause. He mentioned things such as birth of the atomic age, the space race, collapse of the Eastern bloc and the revolutions of the sixties. As usual he had Brethren laughing out loud with talk of twitter, snapchat and the twenty-five Prime Ministers seen since the consecration, well it was twenty-five at his last count.

The Lodge was then handed back to W.Bro. Tom and they quickly dealt with other Lodge business which included an amazing cheque presented from W.Bro. Richard Stone for £1536 towards the Festival.

On to the festive board. For those who have not visited Knaresborough Castle, Brethren it's a MUST. The food is always top class and this time consisted of Carrot and Coriander Soup, Roast Beef, Homemade Cheesecake and Cheese and Biscuits.

R.W.Bro. Jim, in his response to his toast, mentioned it being an incredibly special celebration and talked about all those very special rich characters who had shaped the Lodge over the years. Mentioning all those places they had met before settling in their current home in 1946. The year of the consecration 1922 was also the year the Soviet Union formed, which certainly resonates in todays World, the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb and perhaps more importantly Huddersfield Town won the F.A.Cup. Knaresborough Castle had gone on to see many unprecedented changes in Industry, technology medication and lifestyles. It had also survived the second World War, Brexit and the awful Covid Pandemic. Finishing up promoting W.Bro. Brian Ward Price to P.Prov.G.S.W., tho roughly deserved.

The evening closed with a wonderful toast to the visitors from W.Bro. John Maxwell and was responded to with Bro. Rob Young of Prince Leopold Lodge of Mark Master Masons No. 352 thanking John for his kind toast, the warm welcome, the spectacular upstairs, the festive board and of course the marvellous pork pies served before the meeting.

### Persevering for 100 years



Perseverance Council No. 42 celebrated a milestone of 100 years of service at its November meeting held at Mill House Masonic Hall, Clayton-Le-Moors, Blackburn.

These events are very rare in the Allied Masonic Degrees as the Most Worthy Grand Master, Thomas Firth Jackson was quick to point out that. It will not be until 2034 that another Council will celebrate such an achievement. He was joined at the meeting by the head of our Order in East Lancashire, District Grand Prefect Mervyn Wilson, along with his West Lancashire counterpart Paul Snape, and Joseph McCollum from the West Midlands.

Mervyn was well supported with his team of Acting Officers as well as a good delegation from neighbouring West Lancashire. In total over 50 Brethren were in attendance which is the highest attendance in the Council's 100 years of existence, comprising a total of 390 meetings and 748 ceremonies.

The Council was opened by the current Master, Stephen Barritt, who was very pleased to receive M.W.Bro. Jackson, accompanied by the Grand Director of Ceremonies and did not hesitate to offer the gavel to our Grand Master.

Of course Tom eagerly accepted it and was warmly welcomed with the customary salutations. He congratulated the members on this achievement and gave his best wishes for the future.

He then invited the Council Secretary, Stephen White, to present a history of the Council. On 29 November 1921, 13 Brethren petitioned the then Grand Master, Col Charles Warren Napier-Clavering, and. as a consequence. the Lodge of Perseverance was Consecrated at 4 p.m. on 27 May 1922 at Richmond Terrace, Blackburn. The ceremony was conducted by F.W. Broadbent, Deputy Provincial Grand Master of Lancashire, Eastern Division, assisted by R. Verney Clayton Provincial Grand Secretary.

Just to put things in perspective, at that time there were no mobile phones, no tablets, and no computers and of course no internet. There was no Soviet Union which was formed in December of that year. There was political unrest and at the date of the petition we were just three and a half years from the end of the First World War. The country was emerging from a depression.

Of the 13, several were solicitors, two were ex Majors - both of whom worked in a cotton mill. Eight of them served as Master of Perseverance Lodge of Mark Master Masons from which Lodge this Allied Council had originated.

The Council started with a flourish. At the second meeting no fewer than nine members had the Degree of St Lawrence conferred upon them, there were two more at the third meeting and another at the fourth. At that same 4th meeting 12 became Knights of Constantinople, and the 5th meeting saw 10 become Grand Tilers of Solomon.

On 9 March 1929, 12 members became Knights of Constantinople, and the same 12 became Grand Tilers of King Solomon. There was also an Installation, all in 1 hour 15 minutes.

The following meeting in July 1929 was a special meeting and saw the first ceremony of Red Cross of Babylon. 13 members conferred.

In March 1933 there was a visit from the Grand Master, Dr Charles Herbert Perram, who took part in the ceremony of the Red Cross of Babylon, as the Illustrious Sovereign in the Court of Darius. He also acted as M.E. President in the Degree of Grand High Priest which followed. Three Brethren in the former, and five in the latter, no doubt had very happy memories of the occasion.

The Grand Master must have enjoyed himself in March 1933 because he returned in May 1935, and acted, as King Solomon in Grand Tilers and President in Grand High Priest. There is reference in the minutes of October 1942 that a dispensation for a change of date was not necessary because of the Emergency regulations issued on 23 September 1939. This is the only reference in the minutes to World War II, and all regular meetings were held as they were scheduled.

At the time of the Consecration there was only one District which now has been split into East and West Lancashire. In its time, the Council had moved to Rishton, before settling at Mill House which is close to both Blackburn and Accrington. Membership numbers have gone up and down over the years and recently the future of the Council has been steadied with a large influx of joining members and now has a Candidate to admit at its next meeting, so the future is looking bright. Tom Jackson concluded that the Council can now look forward to the next 100 years.

There was another important item of business: Deputy District Grand Prefect, Peter Hegarty, had stepped down following his promotion in the Craft to Assistant Provincial Grand Master, it was time to appoint and invest Graham Newton, a member of Perseverance Council, as his successor.

Tom invited Mervyn Wilson to take the chair and perform this duty with the help of his Senior and Junior Wardens who were likewise placed at their stations. An escort was formed and Graham was duly presented, obligated and invested. Likewise, Trevor Parvin was appointed as District Grand Secretary to fill the role previously filled by Graham.

Graham was warmly applauded and congratulated before Mervyn invited the Master, Stephen Barritt, to resume his rightful place. The next meeting being the Installation, the next Master was selected, who is to be Allan Shields who will take up the baton from Stephen in May and lead the Council into the next 100 years.

With the Council closed, the Brethren retired to the festive board for fine food and good company which sealed a perfect end to this memorable and unique meeting.

The Home is supported by all four constitutions operating in South Africa and funds will go towards repairs of the specialised wheelchairs that they require.

The Masonic Home for the Quadriplegic and Paraplegic is a non-profit organisation and has seven residents, all of whom are wheelchair bound and need 24-hour care.

'Changing the Memory' – Woodland House Baby and Pregnancy Loss Bereavement Centre



Members of the Mark Province of Warwickshire paid a very worthwhile and emotional visit to the Birmingham Women's Hospital recently as honoured guests at the ground-breaking ceremony of the new Woodland House Baby and Pregnancy Loss Bereavement Centre.

The MBF made a significant grant of £100,000 to the project in its early stages of fundraising to sponsor its dedicated counselling room. This in turn helped the project secure further funding from many other parties. The centre will be the first in the UK to provide help and support to those families who have suffered pregnancy loss or neonatal bereavement.

Sarah-Jane Marsh, CEO of Birmingham Women's and Children's NHS Foundation Trust, said it was all about 'Changing the memory' of how women and families receive the news of a loss and how they deal with their own grief in a calm and dignified environment - something that is not always available to them.

It is hoped that this will be the first of many centres to be built around the UK and its development is being closely watched by many other Trusts.

This is a unique project our organisation invested in and something all Mark Master Masons should all be proud of.

R.W.Bro. Phil Wills, Prov.G.M.; W.Bro. Nigel Clemson, P.G.S.D., Asst.Prov.G.M.; and W.Bro. Darren Coleman-Heald, P.G.S.D., M.M.H. Charities Manager, all attended the ceremony.
