A new Provincial Grand Master for Durham



On Monday, 28 November a very foggy day dawned over "The FED" at Dunston for the Installation of the new Provincial Grand Master for the Mark Province of Durham.

There was lots of activity from early hours to set everything up and prepare for the formalities which were to follow. This would be the culmination of many weeks of diligent preparation by Allan Gurney and his team, and also Mike Davies and the ceremonial team. The installing team from Grand Lodge assembled and progressed through practices with the officers from Durham, with the aim of a problem free ceremony.

Whilst this was going on, Brethren started arriving from all over the country and assembled for the big occasion, with an excited atmosphere building. A new Provincial Grand Master had to be installed following the recent appointment of Denny Wilson as Assistant Grand Master.

There was an air of anticipation building along with a few nerves for the big event. What would follow, was a splendid and slickly performed ceremony with all the panache and pomp to be expected of such an occasion.

To enable the meeting to proceed, Presiding Officers Frank Rankin and Danny Guy, both Past Deputy Provincial Grand Masters of the Province, opened Provincial Grand Lodge. The Pro Grand Master, M.W.Bro. John Prizeman, and his team from Grand Lodge were announced and entered in majestic procession. They then occupied the various offices and took over to install the new Provincial Grand Master.



The Pro Grand Master, acting as Installing Officer, addressed the meeting and thanked Frank for his service to the Province and also for acting as Presiding Officer. In a slight break with protocol, the Past Prov.G.M. was allowed to attend, much to the delight of all present, although it was pointed out with a smile, that Denny was here as the Assistant Grand Master.



The Patent of Appointment was presented to the Installing Officer. An escort was prepared comprising of members of Mark Lodges from across the Province of Durham. They then re-entered accompanying the Prov.G.M. Designate, David Nigel Hanson. The chain of office was proudly carried at the front of the procession by Gil Crossley Snr. The Patent of Appointment from the Grand Master was read to all present by the Deputy Grand Secretary, Dan Heath.

The new Provincial Grand Master was duly presented, obligated, invested and installed by the Installing Officer, John Prizeman. David was then proclaimed Provincial Grand Master of the Province of Durham by the Grand Director of Ceremonies.

With David in the chair, the job of the day however was only partly completed. David then had the pleasure to instal the new Deputy Provincial Grand Master, Trevor Lynn in similar grandiose manner. The new Assistant Provincial Grand Master, Michael Wilkinson was then installed with the same splendour.

David then thanked the Pro Grand Master and his team for making the day such a wonderful occasion for the Province of Durham. David commented on how busy the Pro Grand Master is in his new role, having just performed ceremonies in Switzerland, Italy and Romania as well as installing two new Provincial Grand Masters. He also took the opportunity to acknowledge his good

judgement of character, having appointed Prof. Denovan Wilson as Assistant Grand Master. David then made his presentation to the assembled brethren.

Following closing of Provincial Grand Lodge, the hall was readied for the banquet where everyone enjoyed a fine meal and a few drinks. It was a wonderful happy and friendly atmosphere where enjoyment was the order of the day.



In replying to his toast, the Pro Grand Master, John Prizeman stated that it had been his pleasure to install the 10th Provincial Grand Master of Durham Mark Province. However, he was no stranger to Durham, having attended the AGM as the Prov.G.M. for Hampshire & Isle of White and more recently at a number of centenary celebrations. He acknowledged that occasions such as this take much time and effort to organise and thanked the Provincial Grand Secretary, Allan Gurney for his work.

In addressing the membership, he advised that this Province can only prosper by supporting the new Provincial Grand Master. But above all, continue to enjoy yourselves. It has been a special day, the Provincial Grand Master's role is a very demanding one, but David brings a wealth of experience and knowledge, with your support he will be able to lead the Province.

It is customary for meetings of Provincial Grand Lodge to be covered by members of the St. John's Ambulance Service, this was no different. In recognition of their continued support and assistance, the Durham Mark Benevolent Fund presented a cheque towards their funds.

Steanforde Lodge of Mark Master Masons No. 752



On Wednesday, 30 November 2022 the Brethren of the Steanforde Lodge of Mark Master Masons, based in Stamford, Lincolnshire, were honoured by the presence of the Deputy Grand Master, R.W.Bro. Francis Charles Spencer, escorted by W.Bro. Francis Hatton, A.G.D.C. This momentous occasion was to mark the presentation of the Lodge's Centenary Warrant confirming that the Lodge had met continuously since its concentration on 29 June 1922.

A large number of Provincial Grand officers accompanied the Provincial Grand Master of the Mark Province of Northampton, Huntingdon and Bedford, R.W.Bro. R.A. Stokes, and joined the members of the Lodge to witness the presentation of the Warrant by the Deputy Grand Master to the Master of the Lodge, W.Bro. A.R.M. Barnes. An oration describing the history of the Lodge, from its beginning at a local hotel to its current home in the former Stamford Blue Coat School, was delivered by W.Bro. S. Morgan. The oration emphasised the Lodge's charitable activities, an important feature of the Mark Degree.

During the Ceremony, the Lodge also received the Provincial Travelling Keystone from the Powys Lodge of Mark Master Masons No. 685. As its name suggests, the Travelling Keystone will pass from Mark Lodge to Mark Lodge to emphasise their unity and encourage visiting within the recently consecrated Province which celebrated its first Birthday early in November. Each of the members of the Lodge was presented to the Deputy Grand Master, a gesture which everyone appreciated.

The evening concluded with an excellent Festive Board during which the Deputy Grand Master congratulated the members of the Lodge for their commitment to Mark Masonry and presented the Worshipful Master with the newly struck token which commemorates the 40 years' service by the R.W.Bro. HRH, Prince Michael of Kent, *GCVO*, as Grand Master.

This was truly an historic and wonderful event and the Brethren of Steanforde Lodge look forward to the next 100 years of brotherhood, ritual, and charitable activities.



Marshals do it in style



The much talked about Preceptory for Great and Provincial Marshals, including Deputies, is now a reality.

On Saturday, 26 November last, Leamington Priors Preceptory No. 647, part of the Provincial Priory of Warwickshire, was taken out of Abeyance and restored to the list of active Preceptories.

Seventy five Knights, including thirty five Joining Members, from across our Great Priory of England and Wales, travelled to Knowle Masonic Rooms to restore Learnington Priors Preceptory.

In attendance was The Most Eminent and Supreme Grand Master, Paul Raymond Clement, G.C.T. He honoured the Preceptory by conducting the Ceremony and then opening the Preceptory.

Let me give you a flavour of the ceremony. With the Knights all assembled the Provincial Prior for Warwickshire, R.E.Kt. Roger E. Dixon, was escorted into the Preceptory by his Provincial Officers who he then placed into the corresponding Offices of the Preceptory.

The Great Marshal entered and announced that the Most Eminent and Supreme Grand Master was without and demanded admission. Under an Arch of Steel and escorted by two K.C.T..s, two Provincial Priors and two Very Eminent Knights, the M.E. & S. G.M. entered and accepted the Baton from the Provincial Prior. He addressed the Knights as to his reason for being in attendance and instructed the Provincial Marshal to start the proceedings.

The Provincial Prior informed the M.E. & S. G.M. that he had kept the warrant of Learnington Priors Preceptory in his safe keeping and presented it to him in the understanding he wished it to be returned to the Preceptory. The warrant was then placed on display.

Upon Abeyance the banner of the Preceptory had been passed to the parish church of St Mary the Virgin, Temple Balsall (Warwickshires Spiritual Home and the site of an original Knights Templar Encampment) to remain there, according to ancient custom, until it turned to dust. Until a new banner was commissioned the Preceptory would meet under the 'Beauceant Standard;' this was duly unfurled.

The M.E. & S. G.M. then opened the Preceptory and declared that Learnington Priors Preceptory had returned from the darkness of abeyance into to the light that would enable it to meet once more.

The M.E. & S. G.M. then handed the baton to The Provincial Prior. R.E.Kt. Roger Edward Dixon then Installed R.E.Kt. Timothy John Wheeler, K.C.T., the Great Marshal, as Eminent Preceptor.

After the new Preceptory Officers were Invested the Provincial Prior placed the Preceptory Minutes into the safe keeping of the Eminent Preceptor.

The M.E. & S. G.M. took the opportunity to present a Swift to the Provincial Priory of Warwickshire in appreciation for the donations made to the St John of Jerusalem Eye Hospital.

The agenda was then followed; at this time a motion was carried to change the name of the Preceptory to reflect its new identity. Subject to the approval of the M.E. & S. G.M. at his Council meeting, the name will change to The Preceptory of Barthélemy de Quincy; he was appointed as The Great Marshal by the last Grand Master, Jacques de Molay, in 1294.

The Festive Board was no less a grand affair than you would expect. With seventy five present, mostly Marshals (known for their clear voices) was a lively and convivial affair. The M.E. & S. G.M. responded to his toast and then proposed a toast to the Preceptory in that quiet and insightful manner that we are all used to and love. Humour and acknowledgement of those responsible for the smooth running of the meeting were included, as one would expect.

The Festive Board concluded with a glass of port, provided by the Eminent Preceptor, starting a new tradition. Now named 'The Marshals' Port.'

Shortly after this, on 31 October, the Provincial Prior for Essex, R.E.Kt. Anthony John Helliar, and the Provincial Sub Prior, E.Kt. Roger Smith, attended the Chelmsford branch of 'Andy's Man Club' to present on behalf of the Knights of the Province of Essex a cheque for £400 as a donation towards their funds to assist them in the important work that they carry out.

At Andy's Man Club, their aim is to eliminate the stigma surrounding mental health and create a judgment-free, confidential space where men can be open about the storms in their lives. They aim to achieve this through weekly, free-to-attend peer-to-peer support groups for men aged over 18. Andy's Man Club is a National Organisation whose groups now operate throughout the country and are completely volunteer-led, with the vast majority of group facilitators having first interacted with #ANDYSMANCLUB when they came through the door as a service user. In 2021 they earned the Queens's award for voluntary service.

The club has groups in Chelmsford, Basildon and Southend all meeting on a weekly basis.

Hospital Update

Japanese Government Funds Medical Equipment in Gaza

in August this year, Mr. Hattori Takashi, Representative of Japan to Palestine, visited St. John Eye Hoopital in Gaza, to celebrate the installation of medical equipment funded by the Japanese government, through the Grassroots Grant Assistance and Humanitarian Servinity Program (GGP).

In his speech, Mr. Takashi emphasized Japan's commitment to enhancing human security in the region and to implementing economic and social development projects. This project will significantly contribute to the ophthalmic services we can provide for our petients in Gaza, by funding equipment needed for corneal topography as well as two slit tamps and a defibrillator.



The project will majorly reduce the suffering of patients living in the Gaza Strip, who need advanced surgical intervention and will reduce waiting lists for eye surgeries at St. John Eye Hospital in Gaza.

Grand Opening of the NEW Kufor Aqab Clinic

We are proud to announce that St John Eye Hospital Group has founded a new clinic in the town of Kufor Agab, near Jerusalem, which opened its doors in September 2022! Our Kufor Agab Clinic will treat around 15,000 patients per year from the town of Kufor Agab as well as Famaliah Cliy and the surrounding areas.

The new clinic was opened by Sir Andrew Cash, who is the Chairman of the St John Eye Hospital Board of Trustees. Sir Andrew was joined by Nigel Heath, Prior of the USA and Prof. Mark Compton, Lord Prior of the Order of St John. The official opening was followed by a small reception with Palestinian Knafeh (a traditional middle eastern dessert) and

Our CEO of St John Eye Hospital Group, Dr Ahmad Ma'all, has said that the Kufor Agab clinic will alleviate the local people from travelling Lo Jeuruslem and waiting for entry permits to be issued before they receive the ophthalmology services they require. This project has been funded by the US Priory and took two morths to set up. The clinic has two permanent members of staff who are supported by other staff from our Jerusalem and West Baink services.
