Welcome to the first edition of 2023

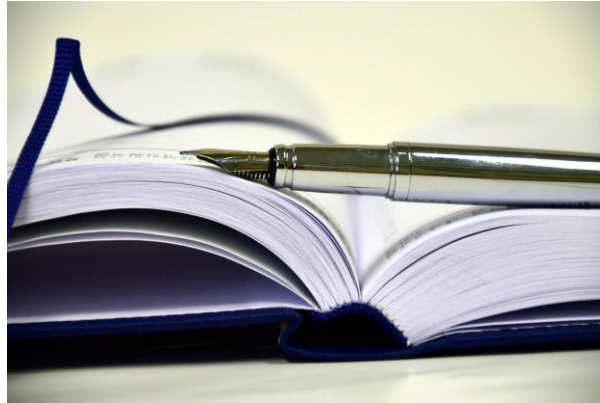


We hope you had a peaceful and relaxing festive season and that the new year has started as you had hoped. All of us at Mark Masons' Hall send you our very best wishes for 2023.

Although originally sold out as usual, the subsequent train strikes caused considerable disruption which affected the attendance. Nevertheless, the organizer, Commanding Officer (CO) Air Cdr. Paul Fitzgerald, was still able to welcome the Guest of Honour R.W.Bro. Ryan Williams, P.G.J.W., along with just under a 100 attendees to the annual AAC-AFA 'Top Gun' Dinner held in the Royal Air Force Club on Friday, 16 December, to raise a donation for the Mark Benevolent Fund (MBF)

In the absence of the regular bugler, who could not get into London due to the train situation, Piper Paul Burgess, piped the CO and the Guest of Honour into the splendour of the Sovereign's Room. And as is now customary, during breaks in the dining, the CO performed 'Taking the Salute' with each table. And after some initially dodgy saluting and table thumping from those seated, eventually everyone got into the swing of things again. And those knocking on the table to represent the cannon fire, finally managed to do so as required. Namely, altogether at the same time in one wonderful motion, or to put it another way, in unison!

The toasting session commenced with the CO proposing the Commanders-in-Chief, President Joseph R. Biden, and His Majesty King Charles III. Lt. Cdr. Kevin Todd, *MBE; RN*, then proposed the toast to the American Air Corps/United States Air Force/Royal Air Force. In responding, the CO proposed the MBF and presented a cheque for £1000 to R.W.Bro. Ian Clark, Provincial Grand Master for Surrey Mark, who responded. In doing he expressed his appreciation for the donation to the MBF, and described the good work that they do throughout the year. The Prov.G.M. then passed the cheque onto R.W.Bro. Ryan, who also expressed his thanks to all present.

V.W.Bro. David Wallis celebrates 60 years in Mark Masonry



On Monday, 9 January, at Gravesend's Gordon Lodge, V.W.Bro. David Arthur Orlando Wallis, P.G.J.O., received a Certificate of Recognition from our Deputy Provincial Grand Master, W.Bro. Martyn Summers, to celebrate more than 60 years continuous membership of Mark Masonry.

David was born in Surrey in 1935, where he was also educated before joining The Corps of Royal Engineers, seeing active service in Egypt and Cyprus.

Very much a family man, David has been married to Barbara for 66 years. They have one daughter, one grandson, (who is a Past Master of the town's Portcullis Craft Lodge), and a great grandson.

David's masonic journey began over 65 years ago, when he was Initiated into Sir Walter St John Lodge in London in October 1957. He joined the aforementioned Portcullis Lodge in 1973, becoming Worshipful Master in 1999. He had been appointed to the rank of Provincial Grand Steward for the Province of East Kent in 1980.

In the Mark Degree, David was Advanced in the Province of London's Centenary Lodge No.1200 in February 1962, (the year that the first James Bond film, Dr No, was released), becoming Master in 1970. In 1980, again, he was appointed a Grand Steward, becoming Master of the most prestigious Grand Stewards' Lodge No. 9002 in 2008. David was Promoted to P.G.J.D. in 1988 and then to his current rank of P.G.J.O. in 2010.

In January 2001, David became a Member of the Mark Province of Kent when he joined Gordon Lodge No. 364. He was Elevated in the Gordon Lodge of Royal Ark Mariners in May of the same year, becoming Commander in 2005. He was Appointed to Prov.R.A.M.G.R. in 2010.

Outside of Masonry, David was a keen golfer until he was forced to retire in 2017 for health reasons. He has always had an interest in his local community and served in various roles within the Scout movement for some 73 years, including the offices of Assistant District Commissioner and County Treasurer. He even finds time to be a volunteer for the National Trust at Sissinghurst Castle.

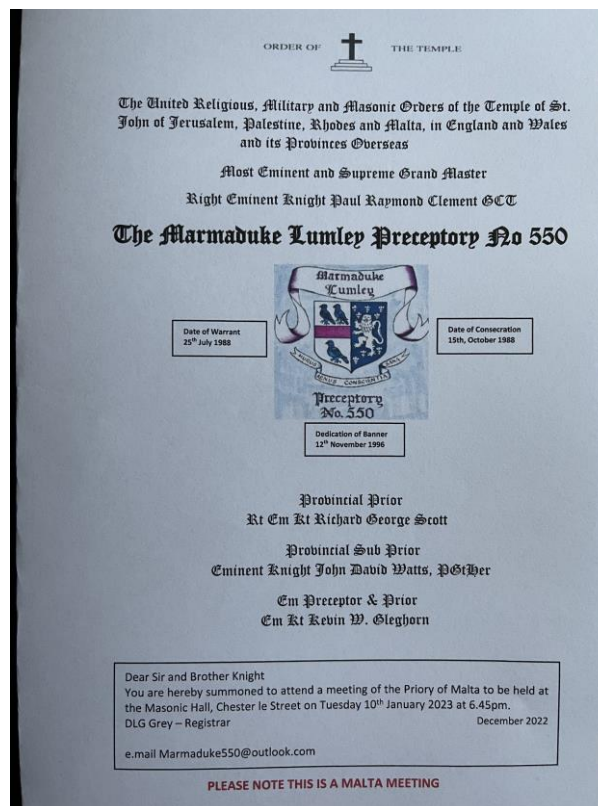

Mark Benevolent Fund Dogs for Good 2022 Summary



W.Bro. Darren Coleman-Heald, P.G.S.D., Charities Manager Mark Masons' Hall, has also received this update from our friends at Dogs for Good.

Dear Darren

I hope you and the Trustees are well. The Mark Benevolent Fund has very kindly donated to Dogs for Good for several years. We are extremely grateful for your support which enables us to transform the lives of people with disabilities through the "good" of our specially trained dogs. It is with pleasure that I write with a summary of our work during the last 12 months.

In 2022 we have:

- created over 30 assistance dog partnerships and supported approximately 300 existing partnerships that are benefiting adults with dementia, autistic children and physically disabled adults and children;
- supported nearly 200 families to train their pet dog to help their autistic child cope better with everyday activities and situations that can overwhelm them;
- delivered approximately 220 sessions with our 11 community dogs to enable people with autism, dementia and learning disabilities to develop skills, reduce their social isolation and access their local community safely and confidently. Our sessions with our community dogs are based on "Animal Assisted Interventions" (AAIs) which involve us delivering activities that help each client with their individual health and social care needs. At the start of this year we became the first UK organisation, and the second in Europe, to gain accreditation from Animal Assisted Intervention International (AAII) which is the governing body for AAI practitioners.

We currently have over 600 volunteers who are the lifeblood of our work. We were delighted when The League of Mercy Foundation awarded one of our volunteers an Order of Mercy medal in July. The Foundation honours outstanding voluntary work. Our volunteer who received the medal has given more than 20 years of voluntary service to Dogs for Good in her roles as Puppy Socialiser, Fundraiser and Ambassador.

Our work has attracted both regional and national publicity and we have appeared on BBC Radio Oxford, for example, and Sky News. In conjunction with the insurance company More Than, TV presenter Lorraine Kelly has supported our publicity campaigns during the year which have highlighted the mental health benefits of dogs.

On 25 December we are the charity featuring in the BBC Radio 4 Appeal which is a weekly programme highlighting the work of a charity and appealing for donations. The sports broadcaster Andrew Cotter will be presenting our appeal.

In November our Chief Executive Peter Gorbing retired after nearly 30 years at Dogs for Good. Ed Bracher has taken over Peter's role and joins us from Riding for the Disabled Association (RDA) where he was Chief Executive.

In 2023 we will be celebrating Dogs for Good's 35th anniversary. We are looking forward to expanding our work and reaching many more people seeking our help.

It is thanks to the generosity of The Mark Benevolent Fund that we are able to continue making life-changing differences for adults and children living with disability. As one of our clients says: *"My assistance dog enables me to be independent. I love the fact that we can just go out together and get on with life. We don't need anyone else – it's just me and him against the world!"*.

On behalf of all at Dogs for Good, thank you very much for your support which is helping to empower people with disabilities to lead the life they want to live. We wish you a Happy Christmas and a peaceful 2023.
