

The Hampshire and Isle of Wight Royal Ark Mariner Annual Assembly



The Annual Provincial Royal Ark Mariner Assembly was held on 21 January 2023 at Botley Masonic Centre in Hampshire. This followed the Installation meeting of the Hampshire and Isle of Wight Lodge of Installed Commanders, where the Provincial Grand Master, R.W.Bro. George Deacon, installed W.Bro. Mark Denton as Worshipful Commander.

While this was taking place the guests of the Province were enjoying tea and coffee in the dining room.

Among the guests was our Pro Grand Master, M.W.Bro. John Prizeman, seen here with R.W.Bro. Ian Clark, Provincial Grand Master for Surrey, and R.W.Bro. Roger Richardson, Provincial Grand Master for Sussex.

After the Hampshire and Isle of Wight Lodge of Installed Commanders Lodge was closed, the Provincial Grand Master retired in procession and greeted the Pro Grand Master, the Provincial Grand Master of the Craft Province of Hampshire and Isle of Wight, R.W.Bro. Jonathan Charles Whittaker, and the M.E. Grand Superintendent, E.Comp. Stephen Allum.



He was then seen chatting to R.W.Bro. Malcolm Slater, Past Grand Junior Warden.



The Provincial Grand Master then assembled with his team and the Director of Ceremonies formed the processions into the Provincial Royal Ark Mariner Annual Assembly.



The meeting was called to order to receive the Provincial Officers of the year accompanying the Provincial Grand Master, led by the Provincial Grand Sword Bearer, and followed by the Provincial Grand Standard Bearer.



Annual Assembly was opened in due form by the Provincial Grand Master. The Pro Grand Master, accompanied by R.W.Bro. Jonathan Whittaker, and R.W.Bro. Malcolm Slater, entered and was welcomed by the Provincial Grand Master. The Pro Grand Master was saluted with eleven under the direction of the Deputy Grand Director of Ceremonies.



The Provincial Grand Master welcomed the honoured guests from other Provinces as well as other Orders within Hampshire and Isle of Wight. He then had much pleasure in investing nineteen Brethren with Royal Ark Mariner Provincial Grand Rank, congratulating each recipient personally.

The Annual Assembly was then called off and R.W.Bro. Jonathan Whittaker rose to say he had a surprise for someone in the meeting. R.W.Bro. Malcolm Slater has achieved 60 years in Freemasonry and R.W.Bro. Jonathan thought it would be nice to present him with his Certificate at the Royal Ark Mariner Annual Assembly, in a full Temple. He thanked R.W.Bro. George for allowing him to do this. At that point R.W.Bro. Malcolm received a standing ovation from everyone present.



R.W.Bro. Malcolm Ernest Slater was initiated into Freemasonry in his old school lodge, Richard Taunton No. 7059, in January 1963. He later went on, in 1973, to become the Worshipful Master of Homlea Lodge No. 8151, of which he was a founder. He distinguished himself in the Province of Hampshire and Isle of Wight, first as a Provincial Deputy Grand Director of Ceremonies, then as Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies, followed by Provincial Assistant Grand Master, and he holds the rank of Past Senior Grand Deacon.



In the Companion Orders, Malcolm continued his Masonic journey, in the Royal Arch, he holds the rank of Past Grand Sojourner; in the Mark, Past Grand Junior Warden; in the Ancient and Accepted Rite, 32nd Degree; Order of The Red Cross of Constantine, Past Grand Junior General; Order of Royal and Select Masters, Past Grand Chancellor; and Order of the Allied Masonic Degrees, Past Senior Grand Warden.



In the Order of the Secret Monitor he was Provincial Grand Supreme Ruler for Hants and IoW for ten years and holds the rank of Grand Chancellor. In K.B.H.C. he is a Past Grand Almoner; and in K.T.P., Past 7th Pillar, Knight of Holy Wisdom and Holder of the Grand High Priest's Certificate of Merit. One of his greatest honours in the Order of the Knight Templar was to serve for twelve years, and under three Grand Masters, as the Very High and Right Eminent Great Seneschal. He was also Provincial Grand Master for the Southern Counties of England in the Royal Order of Scotland.



R.W.Bro. Jonathan invited the Pro Grand Master to join him for a photo with R.W.Bro. Malcolm.



The Provincial Grand Master 'called on' Annual Assembly and addressed the Brethren. He thanked the Hampshire and Isle of Wight Lodge of Installed Commanders for hosting the Annual Assembly saying this is the twentieth year the meeting has been held under their banner. He congratulated the four Brethren who received Royal Ark Mariner Grand Rank in December, as well as those he had appointed to Provincial Royal Ark Mariner Grand Rank today.

The Provincial Grand Master said that they had three years to go for their Festival and thanked everyone for their magnificent support. He then had much pleasure in presenting several MBF collarettes. There were three 'Diamond Geezers', one Grand Patron Gold and one Grand Patron.

The Pro Grand Master then retired from Annual Assembly and, after some administrative matters, the meeting was called to order and closed in due form. The Provincial Grand Master, the Deputy Provincial Grand Master, and the Assistant Provincial Grand Master, together with members of the Past Executive, honoured guests and Provincial Officers then left the Temple in procession.

Durham MBF Festival 2029



On Saturday, 21 January 2023, the Durham 2029 Festival launch event marked the official beginning of 6 years of fundraising on behalf of the Mark Benevolent Fund. This will be the fourth time Durham has played host since the Province was formed just over 100 years ago.

The event was held at 'The FED' in Dunston. The evening was a mix of gala dinner, short speeches and excellent entertainment. Guest of honour was David Ashbolt, the Deputy President of the Mark Benevolent Fund.

Also in attendance was the Assistant Grand Master, our own Prof. Denovan Keith Wilson.

Our members, their partners and friends from across the Province assembled for the special occasion. On arrival, they were greeted by members of St John Ambulance Service with the ambulance donated by the Mark Benevolent Fund for the Durham Province. They were also able to view one of the many Blood Bikes which was also funded by the MBF. Some guests even getting a 'feel' for the bike and sitting atop it.





After the meal, Enter CIC introduced themselves and provided the first segment of the evening's entertainment. These young adults performed a number of songs and routines from '50s rock 'n' roll to West-End musicals.



It was then time for the Provincial Grand Master, David Hanson to welcome everyone and officially launch the Durham 2029 Festival.



“Our Festival is in support of the Mark Benevolent Fund. For over 150 years, the MBF has been helping those in need and it itself has been ably supported by Mark Master Masons across the country. It is now our turn ...the Province of Durham...to lead the charge in raising funds for the MBF.

But let us not forget that it isn't just about handing over a sum of money; it is about the joy that will be brought to the downtrodden and the relief that will be given to the needy. Hence, our festival slogan: 'Giving is not just about making a donation, it's about making a difference'.

The Durham 2029 Festival is for everyone and will be a success with your help and enthusiasm. We hope that you as Mark Masons, your friends and families can participate, enjoy, and organise many events that will occur over the next six years.

Let's make that difference."

David introduced the Festival Team and welcomed them to take the stage.



After the introductions, he made reference to Winston Churchill who said, “We make a living by what we get, but we make a life by what we give”. It was now time to introduce the Festival Chairman, John Watts to make his address who gave a heartfelt talk on why we do what we do, and how the MBF helps many across the country, including people in our own Province. After his build up, John then introduced the Deputy President of the MBF, David Ashbolt. David thanked everyone for their enthusiasm and further explained how the MBF provides assistance. He spoke with great passion about the MBF and also the Festival Jewels and MBF Honorifics. In closing, he wished the Province of Durham and its members, families and friends every success with the Durham 2029 Festival.



The evening was then handed over to performer Chris Tame who got the dancing started before a disco rounded out the successful evening.



The Mark Benevolent Fund is a registered charity (no. 207610) and came into existence in 1868. It was founded on the suggestion of the Reverend George Raymond Portal, Grand Master of the Mark. He felt that for charity to be effective, it had to be disbursed swiftly and without the bureaucratic formalities of other Masonic charities. To him it was wrong for there to be any delay in providing assistance to those in need. It was his own Latin tag “Bis dat qui cito dat” – he gives twice who gives promptly – became, and still is, the principal guideline of the M.B.F.

The Office of Compline



The original Templars Code made a reference to the attendance of Templar Knights when the Office of Compline was said by a Priest. In those days the Grand Master would call sunset which is when the service began. The Office of Compline on Zoom is standardised at 7pm GMT

The ancient Office of Compline derives its name from a Latin word meaning 'completion' (completorium).

It is a service of quietness and reflection before rest at the end of the day. It is most effective when the ending is indeed an ending, without announcements, conversations or noise.

After the service the Knights would return in silence to their quarters and go to sleep, in the modern Zoom version participants leave when they choose by logging off in silence. If there was to be an address, or business to be done, it had to happen first, before the start of the service.

In January 2021 the Provincial Priory of Kent's Reverend Knight Les Fraser (2022 appointed Provincial Almoner) hosted the Office of Compline on Zoom. It proved popular amongst Kent Knights and news of this unique event soon spread far and wide. Les decided to repeat the service every fortnight.

Sunday 29 January 2023 marks the second anniversary of Compline on Zoom, the service lasts for approximately 15 minutes with Knights from England, Wales, Scotland, Jordan and Cyprus coming together to pray together and we would love to see you there as well.

All Brother Knights are welcome to attend the above Office of Compline when, immediately before the service starts, the Great Prelate, R.E.Kt. Malcolm Lane, will thank Les for his dedication and commitment and present a small token and mention a donation on behalf of the Congregation of the Office of Compline on Zoom and Templars Prayer Group to St John of Jerusalem Eye Hospital Group.

40th Celebrations at Wudcestre



Monday saw a special event held at the Wudcestre Priory of Malta which meets at the Ashington Masonic Centre.

The Priory was honoured by the presence of both the Right Eminent Provincial Prior, Kevin Stannard, and the Provincial Sub-Prior and Prior of Malta, Bill Bewick, to celebrate 40 years of service to the Order of Eminent Knight Clive Warham, Past Great Aide-de-Camp.

Whilst a born and bred Ashington lad, Clive has lived in Middlesbrough for many years in connection with his work as a school teacher.

His Masonic career is very impressive commencing with his initiation into Ashington Lodge No. 2868 in 1977, becoming Master in 1988. He was promoted in Provincial Grand Lodge to Past Provincial Grand Standard Bearer in 1996 and received subsequent promotion to Past Provincial Junior Grand Warden in 2010. He joined Viking Lodge No. 7934, which meets at Morpeth Masonic Hall, in 2006 and was Master in 2008 and is also a member of Beamish Temple Lodge No. 9815, in the Province of Durham, where he is the Organist.

He was Exalted into Ashington Royal Arch Chapter No. 2868 in 1978, becoming Z in 1993. He was promoted in Provincial Grand Chapter, in 1997, as Past Provincial Assistant Grand Director of Ceremonies, receiving promotion, in 2022 to Past Provincial Grand Sojourner. He is also a member of Indaba Royal Arch Chapter, in the Province of Durham, where he was Z in 2017.

Clive joined the Knights Templar in 1982 when he was Installed into Erimus Preceptory No. 187, in the Province of Yorkshire North & East Ridings, where he was Eminent Preceptor in 1993 and is currently the Organist. Clive was a Founder Member of Wudcestre Preceptory No. 537 in 1985 and is one of only three remaining founders. He was promoted to Provincial Sword Bearer in 1991 and promoted to Provincial Herald in 1994. He achieved Grand Rank, becoming Past Great Aide-de-Camp in 2016.

In presenting Clive with his Certificate and commemorative tie marking his 40 years in the Order, the Provincial Prior referred to the many other Orders of which Clive was a member, achieving Grand Rank in them all.

Clive is a talented musician, and it was nice that he was able to play the organ during the ceremony to further enhance the evening.

Following the ceremony, all present were then able to enjoy a Scottish themed Festive Board, as Burns Night followed later in the week.


