Second ever R.C.C. 50 Year Celebrant in Kent



The Intendant-General for Kent, R.III.Kt. David Green, travelled down to Broadstairs last week to make a special presentation to III.Kt. John Morris, Past Grand Standard Bearer Constantine, Past Divisional Junior General, who was one of the first Candidates of Ebbsfleet Conclave in November 1972, some seven months after its Consecration.

Ill.Kt. John first became Sovereign in 1983, and was one of the first to be Sovereign who had not been a Founder of the Conclave, and once again took the chair in 2008 to help the Conclave out. Ill.Kt. John is only the second individual in Kent's history to have enjoyed 50 years in this wonderful Christian Order and, along with R.Ill.Kt. John Bonomy, K.C.C., (who celebrated 50 years in December 2019), is probably one of the few knights in the Division to have served under all 6 Intendants-General since the Division was reconstituted in 1965. Ill.Kt. John celebrated his 50 years on 16 November last year, and therefore shared an important day with the Intendant-General, as that was the same day that he was installed as Intendant-General for Kent, and R.Ill.Kt. David referred to the fact that on the day that John celebrated his 50 years saying, technically, there had been two Intendant-General in post with R.Ill.Kt. Nick Alder, K.C.C., departing that morning from that role after over 11 years, before he (David) was Installed by the Grand Sovereign.

Sadly John's health is such that since December last year, he has been residing in a specialist unit of the Royal British Legion's Maurice House home in Broadstairs, which is fortunately less than 2 miles from his home in St. Peter's, and he is visited daily by his wife and family. After having visited Ill.Kt. John, the Intendant-General and Nick visited John's wife, Christine, who was at home with one of their children, Kate, and R.Ill.Kt. Nick presented them with a resumé of the speech that he had made at the Conclave's meeting in February to honour Ill.Kt. John's 50 years in the Red Cross, and how, for over the last 35 years, John had held many positions of responsibility. In the Conclave, including

having been Recorder for over 15 years, as well as Treasurer and Almoner. And, as a consequence of this, R.III.Kt. Nick had given a Notice of Motion at that meeting to make III.Kt. John an honorary member of the Conclave in light of his past services to the Conclave and the Order. III.Kt. John had been a Justice of the Peace for the Thanet area, and the resumé indicated that R.III.Kt. Nick had appeared in front of him a couple of times, but before anyone is concerned, this was in III.Kt. John's other capacity as Chairman of the General Tax Commissioners for Thanet, and R.III.Kt. Nick was representing his clients – in fact, as a result of a hearing heard by III.Kt. John, a change in the National Tax Structure occurred, and whilst there are not many people aware of how it came about, those in the know are aware of John's role in that change!



Children With Cancer Fund (Polegate) - driving for success!



The relationship between all of the charities administered from MMH was highlighted earlier this year when Charities Manager, W.Bro. Darren Coleman-Heald, P.G.S.D., joined R.Ill.Kt. Paul Rose, Intendant-General for Sussex, to present £2,500 from the 'Grand Sovereign's Care for Children Fund' to the 'Children with Cancer Fund' based near Eastbourne.



The charity had an old van used to transport the team and equipment to fundraising events. After a trip back to the station in the van it was clearly evident that a more reliable vehicle was in need. The van was already second hand when it was donated by a local builder's merchant. The charity's founder, Chris Downton, had to unplug the battery every night to avoid it discharging due to an electrical fault and frankly it was too expensive to repair. Darren worked with Chris to determine a

way forward and eventually he was in a position to put forward an application to the MBF for a new vehicle.



A grant for £36,807 was made to buy the new vehicle. Guests at the presentation included R.W.Bro. Roger Richardson, MBF Trustee and Provincial Grand Master for Sussex, with his wife, Jackie; The Mayor of Eastbourne; Councillors from the Willingdon and Jevington Parish Council and representatives from the Red Cross of Constantine Division of Surrey.

The whole charity team were absolutely blown away with the news and this shows the close relationship between all charities administered from Mark Masons' Hall. Without a visit on behalf of the Red Cross of Constantine, this small charity that does enormous good in the local community, would probably never have become aware of resources such as the MBF.

A 'Brilliant' donation



King Charles the Martyr Lodge of M.M.M. No. 267 and Kent MBF have been working together to assist Tunbridge Wells Sea Cadets.

The £700 donation, which will assist TS Brilliant who are are trying to raise over £300,000* to refurbish and expand their hall, which was purchased in 1948, is made up of £500 from King Charles the Martyr Lodge and £200 of match-funding from the KMBF.

*At the conclusion of the Second World War, the Unit was rewarded for its efforts with a gift of £1,000 from the Admiralty. With other generous donations the Unit Management Committee was able to purchase the church school building in Albion Road in 1948, which had been used as an ARP (Air Raid Precautions) Station until early 1945. The Unit still meets in this building today.

The aim of this project is to create a fit for purpose establishment for the Tunbridge Wells Sea Cadets, suitable for the next 50 years. This project is necessary to overcome years of under investment and lack of maintenance.

Objectives:

- to provide accessible and inclusive facilities, including welfare facilities;
- to update life expired mechanical and electrical services;
- to provide CAT6 data cabling to new and existing classrooms;
- to provide three extra classrooms;
- to increase cadet and volunteer numbers by 50%;
- to extend the galley to serve as a teaching space;
- to reduce the carbon footprint and heating bills through better insulation;
- to create a rent-able space for public groups to hire to support unit sustainability;
- to provide a space for District and Area(Southern/London) to provide support for MAST and MACT

In 1998 the unit was awarded the Canada Trophy as the Best Overall Unit in the country, beating four hundred other units for this prestigious title and remains in the top three for the Southern District today.

Some of the current cadets had parents and grandparents as members of the Unit. An estimated 3,500 cadets have passed through Tunbridge Wells Sea Cadets Corps in its 88 year history.

The Unit has affiliations with our local MP, Tunbridge Wells Borough Council, Kent County Council, Wiesbaden Town Council, Tunbridge Wells Royal British Legion, Paddock Wood Royal Naval Association, the Chatham Naval Officers Association, the Honourable Company of Master Mariners, the Tunbridge Wells Friendship and Twinning Association, Wiesbaden Red Heralds Band, Holmesdale Lodge No 874 and King Charles the Martyr Lodges of Mark Master Masons and Royal Ark Mariner No 267.

Maidstone Scouts benefit from convenient MBF grant of £13,860



Opened in 1965, the <u>Hamlet Wood Scout Campsite</u> in East Farliegh, just outside Maidstone has been providing camping, outdoor activities and training facilities to members of the Scout and Guide movements and other Voluntary Youth Organisations for over 50 years.

Situated in 27 acres of woodland, the campsite and training facilities are only open to members of the Scout and Guide Associations and other Voluntary Youth Organisations and is run cooperatively by the three Maidstone Scout Districts.

In early 2021, it was originally planned to simply change the fuel for heating and hot water system in the toilet and shower block from multiple gas cylinders to a central gas tank. Following a review of requirements, the project was expanded to total refurbishment and after a successful fundraising campaign, including a donation of £13,860 from the Mark Benevolent Fund (MBF), and other Mark and Masonic units from both West and East Kent Craft Provinces, it was successfully completed earlier this year at a total cost of £35,000.

The works, apart from specialist services, were carried out by volunteers from the local Scouting communities meaning that Hamlet Wood can begin its second half-century of providing many different facilities and activities such as pioneering, abseiling, canoeing and hiking with confidence.

£50,000 donated to ShelterBox

On Monday, 6 February 2023 a series of powerful earthquakes devastated southern Türkiye (formerly Turkey) and northern Syria. The Trustees of the Mark Benevolent Fund were quick to act and by the close of business on Tuesday 7, had approved an emergency grant of £50,000 to help with the rescue efforts in association with our trusted partners at the ShelterBox charity. The charity is sending an emergency response team to carry out crucial assessments and establish how best their help can be deployed. Their international assessment team will arrive in Türkiye in a few days and will be liaising with contacts on the ground to establish how best to proceed.

The humanitarian need in Türkiye and Syria is immense and growing – it is the most devastating earthquake to hit the region in 100 years and could become the worst. The death toll is likely to rise significantly, and thousands of buildings have been destroyed in both countries leaving people homeless, with nowhere to sleep, in the middle of a bitter winter.

ShelterBox provides different combinations of emergency shelter aid and essential household items during its responses depending on what is needed. This could be sending tents and shelter kits, stoves, thermal blankets and clothing to keep people warm through the freezing winter nights. It could be cash to help people buy what they need to survive. Or it could solar lights that help people when there is no electricity. Getting aid into countries and on to where it's needed after a disaster of this scale presents huge challenges especially with damage to infrastructure and supply routes. That's why ShelterBox strategically pre-positions aid around the world, including in Syria.

This donation of £50,000 from the Mark Benevolent Fund will allow ShelterBox to act quickly, adapting how they work to best support people affected by the earthquakes and allowing them to tailor aid packages to what is needed. There are currently no plans to set up a central fund from Mark Masons' Hall.

This is what the grant will be used for by the ShelterBox charity (information taken from the ShelterBox website):

SHELTERBOX TENT - £350

When disaster strikes, families need shelter to feel safe again. When they can't start rebuilding their homes immediately, durable tents can make them feel safe and protected.

Depending on the weather and the place, the shelter needs of families differ. That's why we're committed to providing families with the best possible solutions that suit their needs. From padded tents that can safely accommodate a stove, to medium-sized tents that fit in small spaces and ones that can last years if needed, families can feel at home again.



SHELTER KITS - £60

We provide shelter kits which include a selection of hardwearing tools and materials that are customised to suit the needs of each community.

The tools and materials we send provide the

The tools and materials we send provide the essentials families need to start rebuilding homes straight away, ranging from tough tarpaulin and timber to corrugated sheeting and even room dividers.

tarpaulin and timber to corrugated sheeting and even room dividers. The versatile tools we provide help with everything from clearing rubble to building shelters and even tending crops. Our tools can also be used to build furniture, cut firewood and make repairs.



BLANKETS - £7

Blankets, groundsheets and mattresses not only provide vital warmth, but comfort too when families are recovering from disaster. These simple items can be used in a variety of ways, from bedding to room dividers, and help turn a shelter into a home.



SOLAR LIGHTS - £11

Our solar lights can last up to 24 hours on just one charge on the lowest setting. They are lightweight and waterproof, making them easy to carry in any situation. Because they are so safe, cheap and easy to use, families use solar lights in different ways — for work, education, family activities, or simply moving around at night.

They are more than just light — they can provide comfort and allow families to regain their livelihoods.
