Provincial Priory of Hertfordshire Meeting

Two 50-Year Certificates, an early 100th Birthday Celebration, and the launch of the Provincial Centenary Appeal

On Thursday, 22 June 2023, the Province of Hertfordshire was honoured to welcome the Very High and Right Eminent Great Seneschal, Andrew Christopher Rainbow, G.C.T., to the Annual Meeting of Provincial Priory, held at the Metropolitan Sports Club, Bushey.

The Great Seneschal was in attendance to present two 50 Years' Service Certificates, to the Past Provincial Prior for Hertfordshire, R.E.Kt. Peter Fotheringham, K.C.T., and to the Past District Grand Master (Royal and Select Masters) for Hertfordshire, E.Kt. Peter Baikie, P.Gt.St.B.(B.).

As E.Kt. Baikie was unable to be present at the meeting, the Great Seneschal, accompanied by the Provincial Prior, R.E.Kt. Alastair White, and the Provincial Sub-Prior, V.E.Kt. Michael Beaty, P.Gt.Reg., visited him at home before the Provincial Meeting to make the presentation.

E.Kt. Baikie was Installed as a Knight of the Order on 19 December 1972, in the Hatfield Preceptory No. 424, meeting at the Masonic Centre, The Rose Walk, Radlett.

Having returned to Bushey, during the meeting itself, the Great Seneschal presented the second certificate to R.E.Kt. Fotheringham, K.C.T., who was Installed as a Knight of the Order on 24 March 1972, in the John F. Cleeves Preceptory No. 315, meeting at the Halsey Masonic Hall, Cheshunt.

R.E.Kt. Fotheringham served as the Provincial Prior for Hertfordshire between 1998 and 2004 before being made a K.C.T. in 2006.

The awards were greeted with warm applause, and both Knights were absolutely delighted to receive their certificates in person from the Great Seneschal.

During his address to the assembled Knights, the Provincial Prior informed those present that on 21 November 2023, another Past Provincial Prior, R.E.Kt. John Hay, K.C.T., would be celebrating his 100th birthday.

Taking the opportunity to offer early and hearty congratulations to R.E.Kt. Hay on this landmark achievement, the Provincial Prior then presented him with a hamper and a card as well as the best wishes of the Province and all those present.

The Provincial Prior also used his address to announce the launch of the Provincial Priory of Hertfordshire Centenary Appeal, in aid of the St John of Jerusalem Eye Hospital. He explained that the target of the appeal is to raise £100k over the next ten years, to coincide with the centenary of the re-constitution of the Province of Hertfordshire in 2033.

Following discussions held in February between the Provincial Prior and the CEO of the Eye Hospital, Dr Ahmad Ma'ali Ph.D., the decision was made that the money raised would be used on an annual basis to sponsor Maysoun Daban, a Theatre Nurse at the Gaza Hospital, rather than saving it up to purchase a one-off "big-ticket" item in ten years' time.

Knights of the Province were encouraged to commit to donate the sum of £500 over the next ten years, and those doing so will receive a lapel badge and certificate acknowledging their commitment to the appeal. The badge features the logo of the appeal, designed by Hertfordshire Knight E. Kt. Denis Gibney, and one will be proudly worn by Maysoun whilst she is at work. The certificate was designed by E.Kt. Vernon King, the Provincial Vice-Chancellor of London.



The appeal was kick-started with a hefty donation of £2000 from the Province followed by a further donation of £1000 from the Preceptory of Jacques de Molay, No. 670. The Provincial Prior was also delighted to be able to present the very first lapel badge and certificate to the Provincial Sub-Prior, V.E.Kt. Mike Beaty.

At the Festive Board that followed the meeting, the Provincial Prior was very pleased to introduce Mr Paul Hackwood, a Trustee of the St John Eye Hospital Group and Chair of the Fundraising Committee, whom he had met whilst visiting the Eye Hospital in Jerusalem.

After the meal, Paul gave a very informative talk to a captive audience about the vital work of the Eye Hospital, and how the funds raised by the Centenary Appeal will be put to excellent use. By way of example, he detailed the case study of Sanna, a three-year-old child who would have been blind by the age of seven had it not been for a successful diagnosis, intervention, and treatment by Maysoun and her colleagues at the Eye Hospital.

£50,000 donated to ShelterBox

On Monday, 6 February 2023 a series of powerful earthquakes devastated southern Türkiye (formerly Turkey) and northern Syria. The Trustees of the Mark Benevolent Fund were quick to act and by the close of business on Tuesday 7, had approved an emergency grant of £50,000 to help with the rescue efforts in association with our trusted partners at the ShelterBox charity. The charity is sending an emergency response team to carry out crucial assessments and establish how best their help can be deployed. Their international assessment team will arrive in Türkiye in a few days and will be liaising with contacts on the ground to establish how best to proceed.

The humanitarian need in Türkiye and Syria is immense and growing – it is the most devastating earthquake to hit the region in 100 years and could become the worst. The death toll is likely to rise significantly, and thousands of buildings have been destroyed in both countries leaving people homeless, with nowhere to sleep, in the middle of a bitter winter.

ShelterBox provides different combinations of emergency shelter aid and essential household items during its responses depending on what is needed. This could be sending tents and shelter kits, stoves, thermal blankets and clothing to keep people warm through the freezing winter nights. It could be cash to help people buy what they need to survive. Or it could solar lights that help people buy what they need to survive. Or it could solar lights that help people when there is no electricity. Getting aid into countries and on to where it's needed after a disaster of this scale presents huge challenges especially with damage to infrastructure and supply routes. That's why ShelterBox strategically pre-positions aid around the world, including in Syria.

This donation of £50,000 from the Mark Benevolent Fund will allow ShelterBox to act quickly, adapting how they work to best support people affected by the earthquakes and allowing them to tailor aid packages to what is needed. There are currently no plans to set up a central fund from Mark Masons' Hall.

This is what the grant will be used for by the ShelterBox charity (information taken from the ShelterBox website):

SHELTERBOX TENT - £350

When disaster strikes, families need shelter to feel safe again. When they can't start rebuilding their homes immediately, durable tents can make them feel safe and portected. Depending on the weather and the place, the shelter needs of families differ. That's why we're committed to providing families with the best possible solutions that suit their needs. From padded tents that can safely accommodate a stove, to medium-sized tents that fit in small spaces and ones that can last years if needed, families can feel at home again.



SHELTER KITS - £60

We provide shelter kits which include a selection of hardwearing tools and materials that are customised to suit the needs of each community.

The tools and materials we send provide the essentials families need to start rebuilding homes straight away, ranging from tough tarpaulin and timber to corrugated sheeting and even room dividers.

tarpaulin and timber to corrugated sheeting and even room dividers. The versatile tools we provide help with everything from clearing rubble to building shelters and even tending crops. Our tools can also be used to build furniture, cut firewood and make repairs.



BLANKETS - £7

Blankets, groundsheets and mattresses not only provide vital warmth, but comfort too when families are recovering from disaster. These simple items can be used in a variety of ways, from bedding to room dividers, and help turn a shelter into a home.



SOLAR LIGHTS - £11 Our solar lights can last up to 24 hours on just one charge on the lowest setting. They are lightweight and waterproof, making them easy to carry in any situation. Because they are so safe, cheap and easy to use, families us solar lights in different ways - for work, education, family activities, or simply moving around at night. They are more than just light - they can provide comfort and allow families to regain their livelihoods.
