The Grand President of the Mark Benevolent Fund, HRH Prince Michael of Kent, visits Addenbrookes Hospital



In his capacity as Grand President of the Mark Benevolent Fund, HRH Prince Michael of Kent, *GCVO*, paid a visit to Addenbrookes Hospital, <u>@actcharity</u>, to formally dedicate their new Surgical Robot. The Mark Benevolent Fund made a significant grant of £100,000 towards the £1.5m project to purchase a new upgraded Da Vinci XI surgical robot to assist in cancer surgery at the world leading

complex in Cambridge. Prince Michael had the opportunity to use a demonstration model of the surgical robot and after a short period of tuition he began very adept with the equipment.

Tom Gull, Head of Trusts at the Addenbrooke's Charitable Trust charity said, 'We were delighted that you could visit. It is really important that we mark these significant milestones, and I know that the team were grateful for the opportunity to thank you all for your role in the new surgical robot. We are also really pleased that HRH Prince Michael of Kent enjoyed the day – it was fantastic that you could all have a play on the robot.

We will keep you updated on the ongoing impact of the robot, as well as the broader progress at Addenbrooke's. The Mark Benevolent Fund have made such generous contributions to the development of the hospital over the years and so I hope you feel a part of the incredible things that happen on the Biomedical Campus.'

I am sure that all Mark Master Masons can feel proud of the work taking place at this most important hospital.


























An update from Dr Ahmad Ma'ali, CEO St John Eye Hospital Group in the Holy Land



St John Eye Hospital in Jerusalem (RA)

Holy Land Crisis Update

The last two nights witnessed yet another heightening in the level of air strikes on Gaza. The whole neighborhood where our hospital is, has been demolished including major parts of the university opposite the hospital. On our street, we are the only building that remains standing! However, as a result there has been some considerable damage to the interior of the hospital in the form of collateral damage. The Hospital was not directly hit but all the surrounding buildings were hit using what seems to be massive airpower? The attached prictures give some indication of the level of damage our hospital has sustained. We are not able to carry out a proper assessment, but the obvious damage needs a lot of renovation work etc.

Of course, the Gaza Hospital has been closed since the start of the escalation/crisis and our staff (those we were able to reach) are safe. One of the nurses sadly lost her brother from an attention area where they like

It is obvious that even when the war is over, we will not be able to resume work quickly as the roads are closed with the rubble of the buildings around us. I suspect some good number of weeks will be needed before patients and staff can safely access the Hospital.

As for Jerusalem- we have only skeleton staff on duty because there is a drastic reduction in the number of patients reaching the Hospital. I think the decline may reach even 95% of the usual level of work we have in Jerusalem.

As for the West Bank centers and hospital, there is an almost 80% decline in clinical activities. This drop in the number of patients seen and operated on is due to very strict movement restrictions that have been imposed on all cities and major roads in the West Bank and it is obvious that people are terrified of travelling.

To date, more than 2000 people have lost their lives from both sides.

It is likely that the coming few days/weeks will witness yet more escalation in the level of military actions in Gaza.

We pray for an end to this crisis.














Essex gains its 41st Royal Ark Mariner Lodge

It's a Dogs Life in the O.S.M. Province of West Yorkshire



On Thursday, 28 September 2023 a donation was made from the West Yorkshire O.S.M. Benevolent fund to the Support Dogs UK charity based in Sheffield. This donation received Match Funding from the central O.S.M. Benevolent fund at Mark Masons' Hall so enabling a total donation of £1,000 to be made.

The cheque was presented by the Provincial Grand Supreme Ruler for West Yorkshire, R.Wy.Bro. David Staniforth, together with Bro. Darren Colemen-Heald, Charities Manager at Mark Masons' Hall, to volunteer Gill Wilkinson and support dogs Derek (left) and Nikki.

Support Dogs (Sheffield) is a small charity providing support to people affected by autism, epilepsy, and physical disability in order that they can enjoy a greater level of independence.

They aim to do this by giving training and support to individuals by the provision of a registered support dog. They do not charge for their services, nor do they receive any government or NHS funding and rely entirely on voluntary donations.

The branch currently has just over 200 volunteers and is currently working with 117 families and supporting the training of 52 dogs. Last year the charity provided over 600,000 hours of care for children and adults affected by autism, epilepsy, and disability.

Dany Anderson – the Charities Fundraising Manager commented:

"Providing a support dog to an individual has certain cost requirements amounting to £70 per dog, in order that they can work safely with their charges Your donation will help us to fully equip 14 dogs. This is tremendous support for which we are very grateful".


