Red Cross of Constantine - Grand Imperial Conclave of Germany



On 07 October 2023 the Grand Sovereign, accompanied by the Grand Marshal, attended a special meeting of the Grand Imperial Conclave of Germany to celebrate their 40th Anniversary.

The meeting venue was moved to Goslar to enable a special trip on the steam railway on Friday to the summit at Brocken, the highest mountain in Northern Germany.

A guided tour of the medieval town followed on Saturday morning with the Annual Meeting held on Saturday afternoon and a reception and dinner with music in the evening.

A most successful celebration and well attended by Grand Conclaves from around Europe.

Pictures show the old town, the steam locomotive, the Grand Sovereign and Grand Marshal braving the summit and a bevy of celebrities including Grand Sovereigns from Germany, England, Greece, Italy and Finland as well as the Deputy from France.







Province of Cheshire focuses on Membership Matters



Aside from being in the final year of the 2024 Festival, the Province of Cheshire is also focused on membership, support for its members and the sustainability of all of its Mark and RAM Lodges.

The Initiative, led by the Assistant Provincial Grand Master WBro John Miller, takes an open and friendly approach to providing information to enable brethren to make up their own minds about joining the degree, without feeling under pressure to do so.

Working with the 'Magic of the Mark' concept, the membership approach utilises several methods of raising positive awareness, including:

- -making available to every hall and Mark lodge the Magic of the Mark trifold brochure and business cards, complete with QR codes for the Provincial information sites,
- using this information, simply asking our members to approach those who are not Mark Masons and giving them the leaflets, etc. so they can find out more about the 'Friendly Degree,'
- -the introduction of "Open -door" events, where a lodge would host a Provincial presentation team, who, using a prepared script explain to a point within a closed or called off lodge, the various offices, charitable work, history, connection to the Craft and Royal Arch, operation of a lodge, and what it means to be a member. This is being rolled out across the Province and is followed usually by a fun or themed festive board, so that the potential members enjoy themselves and can ask any questions as they are sat with their invitee.
- organising as a part of the MBF 2024 Festival inclusive events where non- Mark Masons can attend or take part, and in doing so to improve their opinions of the degree, whilst cultivating awareness and support for our charity.

- Lodge help and support, via the Cheshire Cats initiative, a steadily growing team of Mark Masons who are keen to help out Lodges who may be struggling at a meeting to fill an office, and undertake ritual when called upon. We find this also helps with the engagement and camaraderie of younger members who can learn and practice their ritual, whilst also enjoying visiting other Lodges.
- the introduction of a presentation, when invited, to a Royal Arch Chapter, explaining to the Companions what the degree is all about and its link with the Craft and Royal Arch, and how this completes and enhances the Master Masons knowledge of the degree.
- an external link to the Lodge "Lets' Talk" initiative, where any brother can contact a suitable Mark Mason who can in confidence answer or direct them, should they have any concerns, or questions etc. they might feel uncomfortable raising within their own lodge.
- In support of the Royal Ark Mariner degree, we also have a team of senior members who will, by arrangement, visit a Mark Lodge and with the aid of some promotional material explain the RAM degree and why this should be their next step after joining the Mark- again all of the leaflets for this are being made available at our halls, and RAM Lodges.
- the careful use of social media, to promote both orders in a regular and positive manner.
- we also keep in contact with our Lodges who may need help, and to see if we as a Province can provide that support, assistance and guidance as is available to work with the Lodge as appropriate.

We find that by raising a positive awareness and a caring and supportive outlook, and without using a more direct approach we can attract new members and are enjoy a healthy level of advancements and elevations across the Province, and with the post-pandemic settling down period now largely over, our target of helping all of our lodges to achieve and maintain sustainability will be realised.





New Lodge - Ravensworth Union Lodge of Mark Masters No.124



It was a night of celebration and looking forward to a new beginning in Sunderland as two Lodges joined forces to help secure Mark Masonry in their building. On an evening of poignancy, camaraderie and excitement for the future, the well-respected Union Lodge of Mark Masters No.124 and the Ravensworth Lodge of Mark Master Masons No.718 jointly underwent an amalgamation ceremony under the guidance of Provincial Grand Master, R.W.Bro. David Hanson. The unification of the two Lodges now marks the start of what is expected to be a new era for the Order in the Province of Durham.

The decision of two Lodges to amalgamate can sometimes be a difficult one and the decision to do so was certainly not taken lightly. However, the brethren of both Lodges collectively felt that the time was now right to strengthen the bonds between them to ensure the vitality of Mark Masonry in the local area.

The Lodge room was full as the Provincial Grand Master and his assisting officers were given the warmest of welcomes from the brethren of both Lodges, all sitting together already as a show of unity. After opening a Lodge for the purposes of unifying both Lodges into one, much to the delight of the brethren the Assistant Grand Master, R.W.Bro. Professor Denovan Wilson, was then admitted who was desirous of attending this special occasion but in an unofficial capacity.

With the final, separate business matters of each Lodge dealt with, the Provincial Grand Master proceeded with the ceremony, including the reading of the amalgamation warrant for the new Lodge – to be known as the **Ravensworth Union Lodge of Mark Masters No.124**, maintaining the number

and styling of the older of the two Lodges. An oration was delivered by the Provincial Deputy Grand Chaplain on the nature of the shared vision of the new Lodge and the importance of fraternal accord. This was then followed by the necessary ceremonial aspects of the amalgamation in accordance with the traditional customs of the Order.

With the two now bound as one, the new Lodge needed a new Worshipful Master. The honour fell to Bro. Michael Gilmore, who was installed as Ravensworth Union Lodge's first presiding officer. Michael, who has never served as Worshipful Master of the Mark Lodge previously, reported that he was extremely proud to be steering the new Lodge during its formative year. He then proceeded to appoint and invest the remaining officers. At the request of the new Lodge membership, the amalgamation officers from the Province of Durham were then admitted as honorary members of the Lodge; an honour greatly appreciated and accepted on behalf of all by the Provincial Grand Master.

Following the ceremony, the brethren of Ravensworth Union Lodge, their guests and the Provincial team then retired to the festive board that continued to resonate the joy and friendship of the occasion. The Provincial Grand Master paid tribute to the hard work and initiative of the brethren of the new Lodge, recognising that in joining as one, they were helping to revitalise Mark Masonry and that the future boded well for what was now one of the largest Mark Lodges in the Province. He also paid tribute to the Provincial Officers who had assisted at the ceremony, not least of all the Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies, V.W.Bro. Michael Davis, without whose help and skilful command the amalgamation could not have happened.

As an unexpected surprise, the work of the new Lodge had begun even before their joining together, as both had collectively held a charity race night in support of the Durham 2029 MBF Festival. At the festive board, event organiser W.Bro. Mark Smith was pleased to present the Provincial Grand Master with £1100 towards the Festival's fundraising efforts, much to the delight of the Festival

Secretary who was in attendance. With this, those present could sense the optimism and enthusiasm in the air as Ravensworth Union Lodge of Mark Masters No.124 embarks on its new journey. The amalgamation is not just a unification of two Lodges but a celebration of Masonic principles and an example of what can be achieved with the right initiative and the right attitude.

The Provincial Grand Master, R.W.Bro. David Hanson, said "This marks the start of an exciting new chapter in the story of Mark Masonry here in the Province of Durham. Lodges come into existence and some Lodges close, but the strength of our Order is not with the number of Lodges but with our membership. The brethren of the Union and Ravensworth Lodges have taken action and are forging ahead with a new, stronger vision for our Province. This new Lodge's future is very bright and should be an example to all in what can be achieved."

W.Bro. John Spearman's 60 year Certificate



As part of the evening's business during the Provincial Visit led by the Provincial Grand Master to Risingham Mark Lodge No. 1033 on 10 October, R.W. Bro. Raymond Walton intended to present two long service certificates commemorating sixty years of membership of the Mark Degree to W. Bro. John Spearman P.Prov.G.S.W. The first was on behalf of the Grand Master, His Royal Highness Prince Michael of Kent, *GCVO*. The second, on behalf of the Mark Province of Northumberland.

Unfortunately, W. Bro. John was unable to attend the meeting due to ill health. However, since then, on Friday 13 October W. Bro. John received a visit from the PGM, R. W. Bro. Raymond Walton, along with the DPGM, V.W.Bro. Richard Northey, the APGM, W. Bro. Paul Hilditch, as well as W. Bro. Peter Marshall Prov.G.J.W., Master of Risingham Mark Lodge, W.Bro. Edwin Wilkinson PAGDC, also of Risingham Mark Lodge, and W. Bro. Laurence Bell P.Prov.G.J.D. of Hexham Mark Lodge.

W. Bro John was advanced into Hexham Mark Lodge No 1161. on 12 December 1962 and after passing through various offices became Worshipful Master in 1974. He was appointed P.Prov.G.J.D. in 1978, an office he held for 36 years. He resigned from Hexham Mark Lodge in 2008 and became a

member of Risingham Mark Lodge No 1033. the same year, where he remains a fully paid-up member. He has continued to support the Lodge by being active as Junior Overseer in 2014 and then Senior Overseer in 2018, an office he still holds today.

On 27 September 2014 at our Annual Provincial Meeting, he was invested by the then Provincial Grand Master, R.W.Bro. Gordon Craigs, to Past Provincial Grand Senior Warden. This is the highest Provincial Appointment a member can receive and was a very well-deserved promotion.

W. Bro. John was delighted to receive the Certificates and was only disappointed that he had been unable to attend the meeting and enjoy the occasion.

W. Bro. John has always shown a keen interest and desire to support his Lodge, and this has been shown by his willingness to contribute at every meeting of the Lodge since becoming a member. This commitment has been greatly appreciated by all the Lodge members who have also become good friends. Even at the age of 91, W. Bro. John still shows as much enthusiasm for Mark Masonry as he did back in 1962 and continues to prove his love of this special degree in Freemasonry.

We congratulate W. Bro. John for his long and dedicated service to Mark Masonry in Northumberland and hope that he continues to enjoy the companionship and friendship of this wonderful degree.



MBF for funding for a children's race track



Challengers provides play & leisure opportunities for disabled children and young people between the ages of 2 & 18 years old, in Surrey, Sussex and Hampshire. Their schemes give people a space of their own, meet friends and challenge their impairments through play. Challengers operate a nonexclusion policy which means that any child can attend Challengers regardless of the severity of their impairment.

Based in Guildford at the Stoke Park Centre, for 25 years the charity have had an amazing accessible play park in Stoke Park Guildford, but sadly it had reached the end of its life and had been condemned. They launched a campaign to raise £250,000 to build a new, state of the art, fully wheelchair accessible play scheme.

Towards the end of 2022 Challengers approached the MBF for funding for a children's race track in that outdoor play area. The M.B.F. was pleased to provide support in the sum of £40,000 which enabled the charity to commence work, with further assistance provided by donors including the Surrey County and Guildford Council.

The new playground features specialist equipment to facilitate children disabled children, creating a versatile and diverse space with something for everyone and was opened by the Chair of the County Council.

R.W. Bro. Ian Clark as a Past Provincial Grand Master for Surrey and a Trustee of the M.B.F. was invited to the launch, on a warm October evening.

On behalf of the charity, the Chief Executive, Ms. Gen Dearman thanked the Mark Masons for their generous donation.
