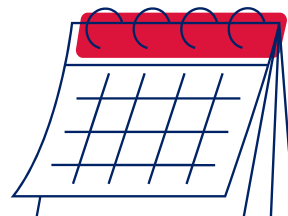

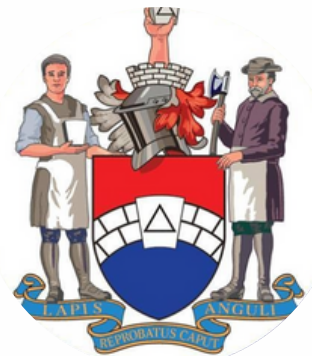

Consecration of Rosario Keystone Lodge No. 2052



On Saturday, 04 November, a historic moment took place in the city of Rosario (300 km from Buenos Aires, the headquarters of the River Plate District). The R.W.Bro. Ernesto Marcer, accompanied by a distinguished District officers, travelled to Rosario to conduct the solemn consecration ceremony of the new Mark Master Masons Lodge, Rosario Keystone No. 2052. It was a day filled with emotion and significance as it marked the return of the Mark Master Masonry to the city of Rosario after 41 years of absence. The consecration brought together Masonic brethren from across the district and marked a grand conclusion to our River Plate District's year. This is a moment to celebrate the unity and brotherhood that Masonry promotes, as well as to look to the future with enthusiasm and determination, bringing prosperity, fraternity, and growth to the region.

Hotspur with Coquetdale Mark Lodge No. 135



Wednesday, 18 October was a very special evening for Hotspur with Coquetdale Mark Lodge No. 135. This meets in the Alnwick Masonic Centre and is the second oldest Mark Lodge in the Province of Northumberland, having been consecrated in May 1871. The Lodge welcomed the Prov.G.M., R.W.Bro. Raymond Walton to their meeting. Ballots were then taken for W.Bro. Steve Buchanan P.Prov.G.M.O. and W.Bro. Les Francis P.G.J.D., both of Nepos Mark Lodge No. 1155, as joining members, and then for Bro. Stephen Whiting, a Shop Manager in Alnwick, as a re-joining member. They were welcomed into the Lodge by the Master, V.W.Bro. Stuart Cairns P.G.J.O., P.Dep.Prov.G.M. A further ballot was taken for Bro. Marc Tremain Lewis, a Master Mason of Lord Warkworth Lodge No. 1879 and former United States Army Master Sergeant, as a candidate for Advancement. He was admitted into the Lodge and advanced into this degree by the Worshipful Master, V. W. Bro. Stuart Cairns, assisted by his officers. Bro. Marc later said how much he had enjoyed the ceremony and the rest of the evening and was looking forward to future meetings of the Lodge. V.W. Bro. Stuart thanked the Officers and visitors who had assisted him with the ceremony, especially W.Bro. Jim Thompson P.A.G.Swd.B. who demonstrated the signs of the degree in an exemplary manner, and W.Bro. Tom Boswell of Amble Mark Lodge No. 780 who acted as Senior Deacon and did an excellent job conducting the candidate throughout the ceremony. The Prov.G.M. then requested that W.Bro. William Gibson P.Prov.G.J.W. be presented to him and he thanked William for his long service, firstly to Coquetdale Mark Lodge No. 1115, then, upon merger in 2007, to Hotspur with Coquetdale Mark Lodge No. 135 in 2007. W.Bro. William was advanced into Coquetdale Mark Lodge No. 1115 in March 1981, becoming Master in 1991, then again in 1996. He was appointed to Prov.G.S.D. in 1996, promoted to P.Prov.G.J.O. in 2002, and then to P.Prov.G.J.W. in 2013. The Prov.G.M. then presented W.Bro. Bill with his certificate commemorating 40 years of service to Mark Masonry along with a tie and badge to mark the occasion and wished him many more enjoyable years in the Order.

The Gala dinner elegantly concluded a magnificent year of the Knights Templar's heritage in the Province.

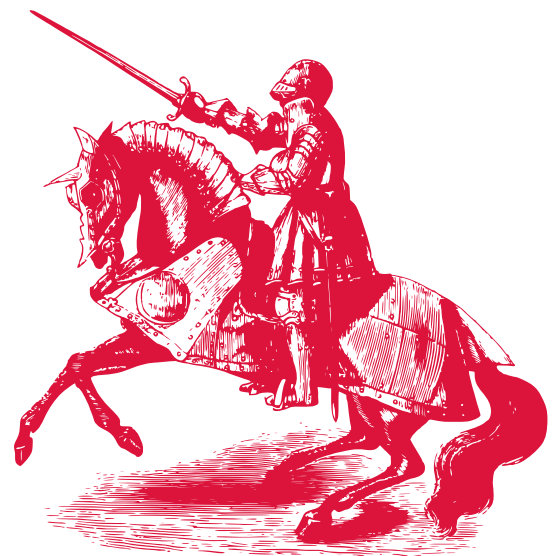




Salebeia Preceptory No. 452

The second presentation also for the sum of £1,000 to a charity called 'Kidneys for Life' who support research into kidney disease, transplantation and dialysis and is a charity very close to The Deputy Provincial Grand Supreme Ruler for East Lancashire, V.Wy.Bro. Stephen Holcroft who was thankful of the charity for the help and assistance they provided to his Son Gareth who underwent a transplant recently.

On speaking to Stephen he said; "Without the help and support from Kidneys for life my 36 year old Son Gareth would have spent the rest of his life having dialysis and would have had a none functioning immune system. After a successful kidney transplant, he can now lead a normal life and has a functioning immune system. So much so that on the 28 September 2023 he became a father himself."
