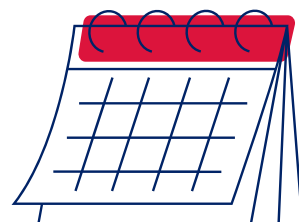

The installation ceremony - Concordia Lodge No. 721 of Mark Master Masons



The installation ceremony at Concordia Lodge No. 721 of Mark Master Masons, took place on 11 January 2024. This is the first installation meeting in 2024 in the District of Hong Kong. W.Bro. Mohan Tarachand Bharwany was installed in the chair of Adoniram by W.Bro. Boris Ding Yue. W.Bro. Mohan was advanced in Concordia Lodge in 2003. He finally agreed to take the chair after his retirement as a Judge of the High Court of Hong Kong.

The picture was taken after the ceremony, showing W.Bro. Mohan, the 6th from the left seated in the front row and W.Bro. Boris, the 4th from the left. The ceremony was conducted by the Deputy District Grand Master, W.Bro. Dr Buddy Tak Ming, the 4th from the right seated in the front row.

The ceremony was well attended by Brethren in the District including Companions from the Scottish and Irish Constitutions. The brethren enjoyed a sumptuous festive board after the meeting.



50 year Certificate



W.Bro. John Robert Grout, P.G.St.B. John Grout played professional County cricket for Hampshire and Somerset, and was also a playing member of the M.C.C. During his illustrious career, Worshipful Brother John scored many half-centuries. But he has had to wait until this year to raise his bat to the Masonic pavilion, to signify his reaching 50 years in Freemasonry.

John was an opening batsman and an off-spin bowler, and fielded at cover-point. When his cricket career ended, he found other outlets for his energies. He has spent many years raising funds in his work for Henley Cricket Club and Henley Rotary Club. Alongside this, John has raised thousands of pounds for Masonic charities, including his sterling work during Oxfordshire's M.C.F. Festival and the ongoing M.B.F. Festival of which he is a Grand Patron.

In what may be a unique occurrence, John was presented with his 50 year Certificate by Very Worshipful Brother Graham Ellis (Deputy Provincial Grand Master in Craft) during a meeting of Thames Mark Lodge in Henley. The Oxfordshire Provincial Grand Masters of Craft and Mark were delighted for this presentation to be held at the meeting of Thames Lodge of Mark Master Masons, recognising the great work John has done.

V.W.Bro. Graham, in his warm address, made special reference to John's quiet but purposeful efforts in charity fundraising during his 50 years in The Craft. All those present in the Temple loudly applauded John. Well done, Brother!

Christmas update from the Mark Province of Leicestershire and Rutland

The first two weeks of December provided a most enjoyable series of events for the members of our Province. On Wednesday, 06 December, the Installation meeting of the Wiclif Lodge of R.A.M. was held at the Wiclif Rooms in Lutterworth. This Masonic Hall has undergone a most effective modernisation over the last ten years or so and now boasts a Community Room, Conservatory restaurant and well appointed kitchen and has proved a very popular meeting place for the Lutterworth Community.

The meeting was honoured with the presence of the Provincial Grand Master, R.W.Bro. Philip Mann, who saw the Master Elect, Bro. Bryan Dewes, installed in an exemplary manner by the Worshipful Master, W.Bro. Mike Muncaster. At our Festive Board afterwards, we enjoyed a good meal and the famous pork pie raffle. In this raffle all the prizes are pork pies made and donated by W.Bro. Martin Sercombe. The raffle raised the astonishing sum of £365 which W.Bro. Nearly 150 members, their families and friends and, of course, lots of children gathered for a reception followed by a lovely traditional turkey meal. This was accompanied by music from the Wigston Brass band and hosted by our very own W.Bro. Rick Morris who kept everyone fully wound up singing carols and trying the quiz until the magic moment when Santa and his elves arrived ringing a bell and getting the children jumping around in anticipation of their gifts.



The sharp eyed among you may notice similarities to well known members of this Province but I am assured that this is purely coincidental. The time then came for the presents to be distributed and these were received with great joy. 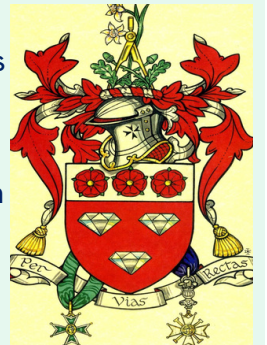


50 years in A.M.D.



On Thursday, 21 December 2023, Allied Masonic Brethren made the drive to Wyrebank in Garstang, the West Lancashire home of Palatine Council No. 89. The reason of this meeting was to honour V.W.Bro. David Keith Rhodes P.G.Reg, who has been a member of the Order of the Allied Masonic Degrees for 50 years, a truly outstanding service to this order. David was a Jeweller by profession with a shop in Preston, a Freeman of the City of London and also a Freeman of Xian, a city in China. The GM also referred to David as being an enthusiast and owner of two Rolls Royce, having written a short book and lectured on the subject. In the little spare time that he has, he is also a qualified pilot, having gained his private pilot's licence in 1975. The GM circulated copies of the Rhodes Coat of Arms around the Lodge room, which had been designed by the Lancaster Herald for David, and granted by the Earl Marshall of England on behalf of the College of Arms. A unique twist to David's Coat of Arms is the incorporation of a Compass at the top, to signify air and sea navigation, but I'm pretty sure that this was also meant to reflect his love of all things Masonic! David was absolutely shocked by this turn of events and warmly thanked the GM for the Preferment. 50th celebration certificates from Grand Council and District Grand Council were read by the District Grand Secretary, Marc Goldsworthy, and then presented to him.

The remaining formal business on the summons was then concluded, and the Council was closed in due form. The Grand DC arranged a procession out of the Council, with David taking pride of place alongside the GM and the WM to great applause. This marked the end of a warm, uplifting and happy celebration of Allied Freemasonry in the Lodge Room at Wyrebank. The atmosphere at the Festive Board reflected that experienced in the Lodge Room. With plenty of chatter and exchanges which demonstrated the enjoyment and harmony of the evening. Wine takings were followed by formal toasts.

Presentation of a donation check - CEDA



On 04 January 2024, R.W.Bro. David Purdie, Prov.G.M. for Devonshire, visited the premises of Community Equality Disability Action (CEDA) in Exeter. CEDA is a charity that focuses on providing learning and social opportunities for disabled individuals, both children and adults. They offer educational classes, specialised therapy sessions, and support for clients to lead fulfilling lives, both at their center and through one-on-one interactions in their homes.

During the visit, R.W.Bro. Purdie presented a donation check on behalf of the Mark Benevolent Fund. This contribution enabled CEDA to acquire the featured specialist Acheeva bed, a highly versatile piece of equipment previously unavailable to them. Given that a majority of the adult clients are permanent wheelchair users, the Acheeva bed offers them the chance to participate in activities from a completely different position.

Witnessing the impact of charitable giving, the pleasure it brings, and the appreciation it receives is truly gratifying.

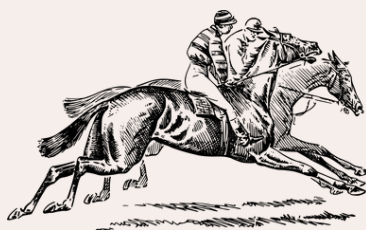

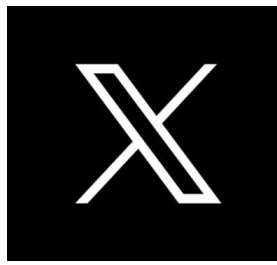
