These newcomers witnessed first-hand the emphasised elements of enjoyment and inclusivity that we actively promote in Cheshire.

Consecration of Benjamin Addy Royal Ark Mariner Lodge



On 29 January 2024 at Dukinfield Masonic Hall, Benjamin Addy, Past Pro Grand Master dazzled the assembled Royal Ark Mariners with his shining display of masonic knowledge when he became the first Commander of the Benjamin Addy Royal Ark Marnier Lodge, which was named in his honour, and consecrated by the Provincial Grand Master of Cheshire.

At the tender age of 89, only 2 weeks away from his 90th birthday, Ben led the team of founding members of the Lodge and showed them that age is no barrier in the Royal Ark Mariner degree. In true Royal Ark Mariner tradition, and making due reference to Noah and his escape, he welcomed at least two Brothers, two Worshipful Brothers, two Right Worshipful Brothers, two leaders from other Royal Ark Mariners Provinces, and two heads of companion orders, including both the past and current Provincial Grand Master of the Craft in Cheshire, a great turn out which proved once again that masons across the world will always offer support to their Brethren.

Following the consecration, the Assistant Provincial Grand Master, John Miller, installed Ben as the first Commander, the officers of the lodge were appointed, and the lodge thanked the Provincial Grand Master and members of the team by making them honorary members of the lodge.

The festive board was loud and lively, and filled with laughter as members and guests intermingled to ensure new friendships were formed.

The icing on an already very rich cake for the lodge was the announcement that two Mark men had completed their application forms and were proposed and seconded on the night, with five more to be balloted for at a future meeting.

Saturday, 27 January witnessed 2 significant events in the life of Canterbury's St Vincent Lodge of Royal Ark Mariners No. 262. Firstly, the Installation of W.Bro. Robert "Bob" Mitchell as Commander, the third time that he has held the Office, in the presence of V.W.Bro. Ivor Spencer P.G.J.O. -Representative of the Provincial Grand Master and W.Bro. Martyn Summers – Deputy Provincial Grand Master. Secondly, the celebration of W.Bro. Brian Woodman's 50th year as a Royal Ark Mariner, which was the reason that W.Bro. Martyn attended the meeting unannounced. Having been Advanced in Canterbury's Cantwara-Byrig Lodge of Mark Master Masons No. 1168 in 1971, (where he is now an honorary member), W.Bro. Brian was Elevated in the City's St Vincent Lodge of Royal Ark Mariners in 1974. He was Installed as Worshipful Commander in 1986 and subsequently Scribe in 2006, which office he still holds. He was Appointed to P.A.G.St.B. in 1999, Promoted to P.G.J.D. in 2015 and subsequently Appointed to R.A.M.G.R. in 1996.





Being a keen allotment keeper, as well as presenting him with his richly deserved 50 Year Certificate from The Grand Master's Royal Ark Council, Martyn gave Brian a special personal gift comprising of a bucket filled with allotment goodies including plants, fertilisers, seed pototoes, twine and numerous other useful items.

During the Festive Board, which was a White Table in Brian's honour, the members of the Lodge presented him with a luxury hamper.

The lodges of Installed Mark Masters and Installed R.A.M. Commanders in the Province of West Lancashire both carry the name of Philadelphia and bear the No. 1646. It is a tradition that the lodges have their installation meetings on the same day with the Mark following on from the R.A.M. On this occasion the setting was Preston Masonic Hall. The principal guest for both meetings was R.W.Bro. Tony Harrison P.G.J.W. Past.Dep. Prov.G.M. and holder of Grand Rank in the R.A.M. Degree. Those descending on Preston from the 4 corners of the Province had to make their way through downpours of almost biblical proportions, somewhat in fitting with a R.AM. meeting. However that did not dampen the spirits of those in attendance. Before the primary business of installing his successor outgoing Commander Alan Eastham had first to welcome 5 new members to the lodge, one of whom was W.Bro. Mike Pinckard the newly appointed Asst.Prov.G.M.

W. Bro. Jim Richards was presented as Commander elect and installed by Alan in fine style. With a new crew appointed to their respective offices and due protocols observed it fell to Jim to close the lodge. All hands were then on deck to re-figure the temple to make it suitable for the Mark degree. The lodge was duly opened and administrative matters dealt with by outgoing WM David Robinson before W.Bro. Andy Wiltshire was presented for installation. Andy is the present Provincial Grand Junior Warden. Once again the ceremony was conducted in an excellent manner. Although the ritual is somewhat abbreviated with both the incoming Master and the Commander being past masters there is also the undoubted pressure of having to deliver the work under the watchful gaze of so many knowledgeable peers. Following the formalities of the lodge room it was time to move from labour to refreshment. In his address at the installation banquet Tony urged everyone to enjoy their Mark and R.A.M. masonry and spread the word by taking that message of pleasure and satisfaction out to a wider audience. Certainly the buzz of conversation, sounds of laughter and the general genial ambiance suggested that those present had all taken on board the message of enjoying their masonry.

The afternoon and evening had indeed exemplified the Magic of the Mark and the radiance of the R.A.M.

The Provincial Priory of Durham social evening



The Provincial Priory of Durham social evening for 2024 was held on 27 January, where members, their partners, families and guests gathered in the bar area of Darlington Masonic Hall. The Provincial Marshal E.Kt. Andrew Peter Fall Foster invited everyone to take their seats in the dining hall. After grace, given in Latin, with an English translation, by the Provincial Chancellor E.Kt. Peter A Smith, those present enjoyed Spiced Butternut soup, Braised beef with Bourguinon Sauce and Seasonal Vegetables, Lemon Posset, Cheese and Biscuits and Tea or Coffee.

After dining, the Provincial Prior Rt.E.Kt. Richard Scott welcomed those present to the Knight Templar social evening for 2024. He gave a special welcome to the Provincial Grand Master of the Craft John Thompson and his wife Andrea.

The Provincial Prior then told his guests about his recent trip to the eye hospital in Jerusalem, where he had witnessed the amazing advancements in eye surgery, being able to watch the unobtrusive removal of a cataract by a Phaco Emulsification machine, in little over three minutes.

The Provincial Prior then went on to inform those present that July of 2025 sees the fifty year anniversary of the Priory of Durham in its own right.

To celebrate there will be a service held in Durham Cathedral, with dining and entertainment held afterwards at Ramside Hall, where it is hoped that the total given to the Eye Hospital in Jerusalem by the province will be £100,000. The Grand Master. M.E. & S.Kt. Paul R. Clement, G.C.T and his team will be in attendance, along with the heads of St John Ambulance service, the CEO of the eye hospital in Jerusalem and other local dignitaries. Details of this event will be released after the AGM in April but early booking is recommended to those wishing to attend.

To conclude his address, the Provincial Prior drew the lucky winning ticket belonging to E.Kt. Ken Short for the Knight Templar chess set which was the idea of E.Kt. Stewart Bell, and had raised the magnificent sum of £1025.

Entertainment followed by Colin Lynch, a Neil Diamond tribute act which soon had those present singing and dancing along. The raffle was then drawn at the end of the night, which thanks to the generosity of those present raised £975.

Eminent Knight Giles Egner, P.Gt.A.-de-C., celebrates 40 years as a Knight Templar





Friday, 26 January 2024, saw the members of Royal Kent Preceptory No. 20, which meets at Fern Avenue Masonic Hall, and their guests from around the Province, help to Celebrate 40 years of continuous service to the Order of one of its most senior Knights, Eminent Knight Giles Egner.

Giles was installed into the Preceptory in November 1983 and was its Eminent Preceptor in 1997. Appointment and promotion in Provincial Priory soon led to him acting as Provincial First Constable in 2006, with an appointment in 2012 in Great Priory to the rank of Past Great Aide-de-Camp.

Tribute was paid to Giles' hard work, commitment and service to the Preceptory, the Province and to the Order in general, being presented with a Provincial Priory "40th Tie" by the Provincial Prior, R.Em.Kt. Kevin Stannard.

Giles has been a Freemason for 52 years, having been initiated in Priory Lodge No.1863 in February 1971; serving as its Master in 1978; and received the very high honour of first appointment, in 1987, to the office of Provincial Junior Grand Warden in Provincial Grand Lodge; and eventual promotion in United Grand Lodge to Past Junior Grand Deacon.

He was exalted into the Royal Arch in Priory Royal Arch Chapter No. 1863 in December 1981 and, after serving as First Principal in 1989, was appointed and promoted in Provincial Grand Chapter to Provincial Second Grand Principal before becoming Deputy Grand Superintendent for 7 years. For his service to the Royal Arch, he finally received promotion in Supreme Grand Chapter to the rank of Past Grand Sword Bearer.

Active in other Degrees, he is a member of Royal Kent Tabernacle T.I. and an officer of Grand College of the Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests; and a member of Royal Kent Chapter Rose Croix, holding the 30th Degree in the Ancient and Accepted Rite.

Congratulations to Giles from everyone at Northumberland Freemasons on a fantastic 40 years of service.

Because of R.III.Comp. David's upcoming retirement, the Grand Master has been considering the appointment of a successor and I am very pleased to inform you that III.Comp. William Agnew Caughie, G.Swd.B., has accepted the invitation to be your next District Grand Master.

Ill.Comp. Caughie is well known to you and needs no introduction, and I am sure you will join me in congratulating him on his forthcoming preferment. His installation will take place on Saturday, 23 March 2024 and R.Ill.Comp. David will retire at midnight on Sunday, 10 March 2024.
